DETAILS OF APPROVED PROJECT: The project includes repair and replacement of an existing side entry. The changes include removing a dilapidated timber awning and replacing it with a new metal awning supported by brackets, see exhibit labeled 'Awning Design – March 2016.' The project also includes rebuilding the existing brick entry stairs and the 3x5 concrete landing with new brick stairs and a paver landing that will match existing in location and dimension. The new bricks and mortar will match existing. To correct drainage issues, approximately 430 square feet of the existing driveway will be replaced with concrete or pavers as indicated on the exhibit labeled 'Site Plan – March 2016.' The driveway's existing dimensions will not change.

This Certificate is valid for a period of six months from the date of issuance. Failure to obtain a building permit in that time will be considered as a failure to comply with the Certificate and the Certificate will become invalid. If a building permit is not required, then the approved work must be completed within six months of the date of issuance of this Certificate. The Certificate can be renewed within twelve months of its issuance by Historic District Commission staff by written request and submission of a valid reason for failure to comply within the six-month deadline.
