DETAILS OF APPROVED PROJECT: Installation of a fence with three access gates around the rear yard. The project includes the removal of a wire fence along the right property line. The new fence will be wood with vertical pickets spaced approximately 2-2 ½ inches apart. The fence will be four feet in height. On the left side, a shadowbox-style gate will be installed between the neighbors shadowbox fence and the primary structure and will tie in behind the front corner of the house. All framing members of the fence and gates will face inward to the property being enclosed or both sides of the fence will be the same. The finished fence will be painted or stained. See attached exhibit labeled 'Site Plan – August 2016.'

This Certificate is valid for a period of twelve (12) months from the date of issuance. Failure to obtain a building permit in that time will be considered as a failure to comply with the Certificate and the Certificate will become invalid. If a building permit is not required, then the approved work must be completed within twelve (12) months of the date of issuance of this Certificate. In either situation, the Certificate can be renewed for an additional twelve (12) months by Historic District Commission staff by written request within the first twelve (12) months from the date of issuance.
