
CENSUS 2010 Population Profile: City of Charlotte



^{*}Hispanic or Latino Origin--This category is not included in the total since persons of Hispanic or Latino origin may be of any race.

Key Points:

- -While still the majority, White population as a proportion of the city's total population declined from 58.3% in 2000 to 50% in 2010.
- -African American population, which accounted for 32.7% of total population in 2000 now makes up 35% of the city's residents.
- -Asian population, which made up 3.4% of the city's total in 2000 now accounts for 5% of Charlotte's total population.
- -People of Hispanic or Latino origin now comprise 13.1% of the city's total population, compared to 7.4% in 2000.

Hispanic or Latino*

- -In the last decade Charlotte grew by 190,596, a growth rate of 35.2%.
- -African Americans saw the largest increase of 79,277 people.
- -Whites saw the second largest population gain of 50,323.
- -Asian population increased from 3.4% to 5% between 2000 and 2010, this is a percent change of 97.6%.
- -Hispanic population grew by 55,888 to 13.1% of total population in 2010 from 7.4% in 2000.
