COMMUNITY MEETING REPORT PETITIONER: HARRISON TUCKER & JOHN PEROVICH

REZONING PETITION NO.: 2018-011

This Community Meeting Report is being filed with the Office of the City Clerk and the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Planning Commission pursuant to the provisions of the City of Charlotte Zoning Ordinance.

PERSONS AND ORGANIZATIONS CONTACTED WITH DATE AND EXPLANATION OF HOW CONTACTED:

A representative of the Petitioner mailed a written notice of the date, time and location of the Community Meeting to the individuals and organizations set out on Exhibit A attached hereto by depositing such notice in the U.S. mail on February 23, 2018. A copy of the written notice is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

DATE, TIME AND LOCATION OF MEETING:

The Community Meeting was held on Tuesday, March 6 at 7:00 pm. at the Salvation Army, 901 Belmont Ave., Charlotte NC 28205, during the Belmont Neighborhood Association general meeting.

PERSONS IN ATTENDANCE AT MEETING (see attached copy of sign-in sheet):

The Community Meeting was attended by those individuals identified on the sign-in sheet attached hereto as Exhibit C. The Petitioner was represented at the Community Meeting by Harrison Tucker and Russell Fergusson.

SUMMARY OF PRESENTATION/DISCUSSION:

The Petitioner's agent, Russell Fergusson, welcomed the attendees and introduced himself and Harrison Tucker, the Petitioner. Petitioner presented the proposal to rezone seeking to rezone the approximate 0.17 acres site (the "Site") located at the northeast corner of E. 17th St and N. McDowell St. (801 E. 17th St.) from an R-5 zoning district to UR-2 (CD) zoning district. The agent explained the rezoning process in general and stated that the purpose of the meeting was to discuss the rezoning request and the conditional site plan and respond to questions and concerns from nearby residents and property owners. The meeting was attended by neighbors and neighborhood leaders.

Mr. Tucker and Mr. Fergusson presented the site plan and explained the basic elements of the proposed development, including the efforts to move forward with plans that will include up to five residential units and the inclusion of an affordable unit for sale. Petitioner explained the basic and the standards and limits being incorporated into the revised Site Plan. The petitioner addresses the need for "missing middle" options for the residential market in the area. After the presentation the Petitioner and attendees were able to conduct a lengthy question and answer session. Extended conversation was had regarding the current developments of large single-family homes that are changing the character of the neighborhood and pricing out residents. Trapid growth in development created by the light rail project. The conversation addressed that some attendees supported the petition because it would create an affordable housing option and a small erunit than the current trend of large and expensive single-family homes. Some expressed a belief that this might help limit the impact of gentrification and allow for more economic diversity—including an affordable for sale unit. Some attendees raised concerns over the density, height and parking. Petitioner and attendees also discussed the sidewalk, existing sidewalks and elevation issues that led Petitioner to modify the sidewalk

and planting strips as presented. Petitioner explained the proximity to uptown, light rail and the greenway entrance across the street, as reasons why the proposed density is appropriate.

Petitioner answered community questions regarding the setbacks, the heights of the building, the location of garages, improvement of the sidewalk but still matching existing and neighboring properties, the parking plans, and the proposed density. Petitioner also answered questions regarding the building materials and environmentally conscience goal of a sustainable and net-zero development. There was no general consensus towards the proposal. Some attendees were positive and that this would be an improvement over the anticipated development of a very large single-family home and the likelihood that current by-right development will drastically alter the nature of the community. Concerns over the architecture style were raised and discussed. The neighborhood plans for residential types were discussed in that while there is multifamily both conforming and non-conforming in the immediate area of the Site, that the Site itself, a vacant lot, was designated for single family.

In addition to this meeting, Petitioner has presented to the neighborhood association land use committee on two occasions and modified the elevation and architectural design to better match the area homes at the direction of the committee. During the meeting a resident and local business owner that lives on the same block as the Site discussed her support for the project's density as being appropriate for the neighborhood.

Included in attendance were approximately thirty area residents including several people that live and own property on the same block as the rezoning.

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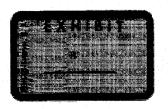
