

COMMUNITY	5 Communities with “Entertainment” in the Definition or Description for Restaurants
Boston, MA	<p><b>RESTAURANT, LUNCH ROOM, CAFETERIA</b> or other place for the service or sale of food or drink for on-premises consumption, provided that there is <b>no dancing nor entertainment other than phonograph, radio and television</b>, and that neither food nor drink is served to, or consumed by, persons while seated in motor vehicles.</p> <p><b>RESTAURANT USES</b> - a drive-in restaurant, restaurant, or take-out restaurant.</p> <p><b>TAKE-OUT RESTAURANT</b> - sale over the counter, not wholly incidental to a local retail business, restaurant, or drive-in restaurant, of food or drink prepared on premises for off-premises consumption or for on-premises consumption if, as so sold, such food or drink is ready for take-out. A take-out restaurant shall include any restaurant with an accessory drive-through restaurant and any restaurant which serves its food and beverages primarily in disposable containers and provides disposable tableware.</p> <p><b>PLACE FOR SALE AND CONSUMPTION OF FOOD AND BEVERAGES</b> -(other than drive-in restaurant) providing <b>dancing or entertainment or both; theater (including motion picture theater but not drive-in theater); concert hall; dance hall; skating rink; bowling alley; pool room; billiard parlor; other social, recreational or sports center conducted for profit; or any commercial establishment maintaining and operating any amusement game machine</b> (other than as an accessory use) provided that such establishment is customarily open to the public at large and does</p>
Chicago, IL	<p><b>RESTAURANT</b> - An establishment primarily engaged in serving prepared food to the public pursuant to required licenses, including those with outdoor seating areas.</p> <p><b>LIMITED RESTAURANT</b> - A restaurant in which there is no service of alcoholic liquor or in which the service of alcoholic liquor is clearly incidental and subordinate to the primary activity (prepared food service) and in which <b>live entertainment or dancing</b>, if any, is clearly incidental and subordinate to the primary activity (prepared food service).</p> <p><b>GENERAL RESTAURANT</b> - A restaurant in which alcoholic liquor may be served in conjunction with the primary activity (prepared food service) and in which <b>live entertainment and dancing</b> are permitted in completely enclosed areas.</p>
Ft. Worth, TX	<p><b>RESTAURANT</b> - Place which is regularly open in a bona fide manner; which is used and kept open for the service of food to customers for compensation; which has suitable seating for guests; which has suitable facilities for preparation and service of an assortment of foods commonly ordered at various hours of the day or night and the serving of food is the primary business of such place, and which may, as an accessory use, provide patrons with <b>space for dancing</b> or permit patrons to dance. Includes</p>

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	<p>restaurants legally authorized (by duly issued permits from the city and state) to sell alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises.</p> <p><b>RESTAURANT, DRIVE-IN</b> - Any restaurant providing car service.</p>
New York, NY	<p>Uses listed in Zoning Ordinance:</p> <p>Eating or drinking establishments with <b>entertainment</b> and a capacity of more than 200 persons.</p> <p>Eating or drinking establishments with <b>entertainment</b> but not dancing with a capacity of 200 persons or less.</p> <p>Eating or drinking establishments with <b>entertainment</b> and a capacity of more than 200 persons or establishments or any capacity with dancing.</p> <p>Eating or drinking establishments, including those which provide outdoor table service or have <b>music</b> for which there is no cover charge and no specified show time, and those which “accessory” drive-through facilities.</p> <p>Eating or drinking establishments with <b>musical entertainment</b> but not dancing, with a capacity of 200 persons or less.</p> <p>Eating or drinking establishments including those which provide <b>musical entertainment but not dancing</b>, with a capacity of 200 persons or less, or outdoor table services, which have “accessory” drive-through facilities.</p>
Philadelphia, PA	<p><b>EATING AND DRINKING ESTABLISHMENTS</b> - Uses that prepare or serve food or beverages for on- or off-premise consumption. Establishments that meet the definition of a use classified in the eating and drinking establishments use subcategory and that also include <b>occasional live entertainment</b> may be classified as eating and drinking establishment uses, provided that any establishment that meets the definition of a nightclub and private club use must be classified and regulated as a nightclub and private club (See § 14-601(7)(c)(.3) (Nightclubs and Private Clubs)). The following are eating and drinking establishment specific use types:</p> <p><b>PREPARED FOOD SHOP</b> - An establishment that does not meet the definition of a take-out restaurant (see § 14-601(7)(f)(.2)), that offers seating or carry out food and beverage service or both, and that is primarily engaged in the sale of prepared food, non-alcoholic beverages, cold refreshments, or frozen desserts. Prepared food shops include establishments known as sandwich shops, delis, coffee shops, and ice cream shops. A prepared food shop has all of the following</p>

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	<p>characteristics:</p> <p>(.a) Includes customer seating on the lot. The number of seats shall not exceed 20 seats; and</p> <p>(.b) Does not utilize commercial cooking appliances that have requirements for exhausting air contaminants.</p> <p><b>TAKE-OUT RESTAURANT</b> - An eating and drinking establishment that has any one or more of the following characteristics:</p> <p>(.a) a drive-through or walk-up window;</p> <p>(.b) a service counter where all customers pay for their ordered items before consumption and all food and beverages are served on disposable ware for consumption, except that cafeterias primarily engaged in serving food and beverages for on-premise consumption are considered sit-down restaurants if take-out service is clearly incidental to the principal use;</p> <p>(.c) no interior customer seating; or</p> <p>(.d) no public restrooms.</p> <p><b>SIT-DOWN RESTAURANT</b> - An eating and drinking establishment that does not meet the definition of a take-out restaurant (see § 14-601(7)(f)(.2)) or prepared food shop (see § 14-601(7)(f)(.1)), including establishments that primarily engage in cooking food on the premises and selling it to customers primarily for on-premise consumption.</p>
