Subject: Rezoning Petition 14-023: Approximately 2.15 acres located on the

Denni E. Row

south corner at the intersection of North Caldwell Street and East 16th Street and generally surounded by East 16th Street, North Davidson Street, and East 16th Street.

CDOT has previously commented on the subject petition in our memorandum dated February 3, 2014.

Vehicle Trip Generation

This site could generate approximately 1,800 trips per day as currently zoned. Under the proposed zoning the site could generate approximately 1,700 trips per day.

CDOT requests the following changes to the rezoning plan:

1. We request the petitioner extend the existing recessed on-street parking from its current location to the 16th Street/North Caldwell intersection.

The following are requirements of the developer that must be satisfied prior to driveway permit approval. We recommend that the petitioner reflect these on the rezoning plan as-appropriate.

- 1. According to the City of Charlotte's Driveway Regulations, CDOT has the authority to regulate/approve all private street/driveway and public street connections to the right-of-way of a street under the regulatory jurisdiction of the City of Charlotte.
- 2. The existing driveway connections to North Caldwell Street and E. 15th Street will require driveway permits to be submitted to CDOT for review and approval. The exact driveway locations and type/width of the driveways will be determined by CDOT during the driveway permit process. The locations of the driveways shown on the site plan are subject to change in order to align with driveways on the opposite side of the street and comply with City Driveway Regulations and the City Tree Ordinance.
- 3. All proposed commercial driveway connections to a future public street will require a driveway permit to be submitted to CDOT for review and approval.

- 4. Any fence or wall constructed along or adjacent to any sidewalk or street right-of-way requires a certificate issued by CDOT.
- 5. A Right-of-Way Encroachment Agreement is required for the installation of any non-standard item(s) (irrigation systems, decorative concrete pavement, brick pavers, etc.) within a proposed/existing City maintained street right-of-way by a private individual, group, business, or homeowner's/business association. An encroachment agreement must be approved by CDOT prior to the construction/installation of the non-standard item(s). Contact CDOT for additional information concerning cost, submittal, and liability insurance coverage requirements.
