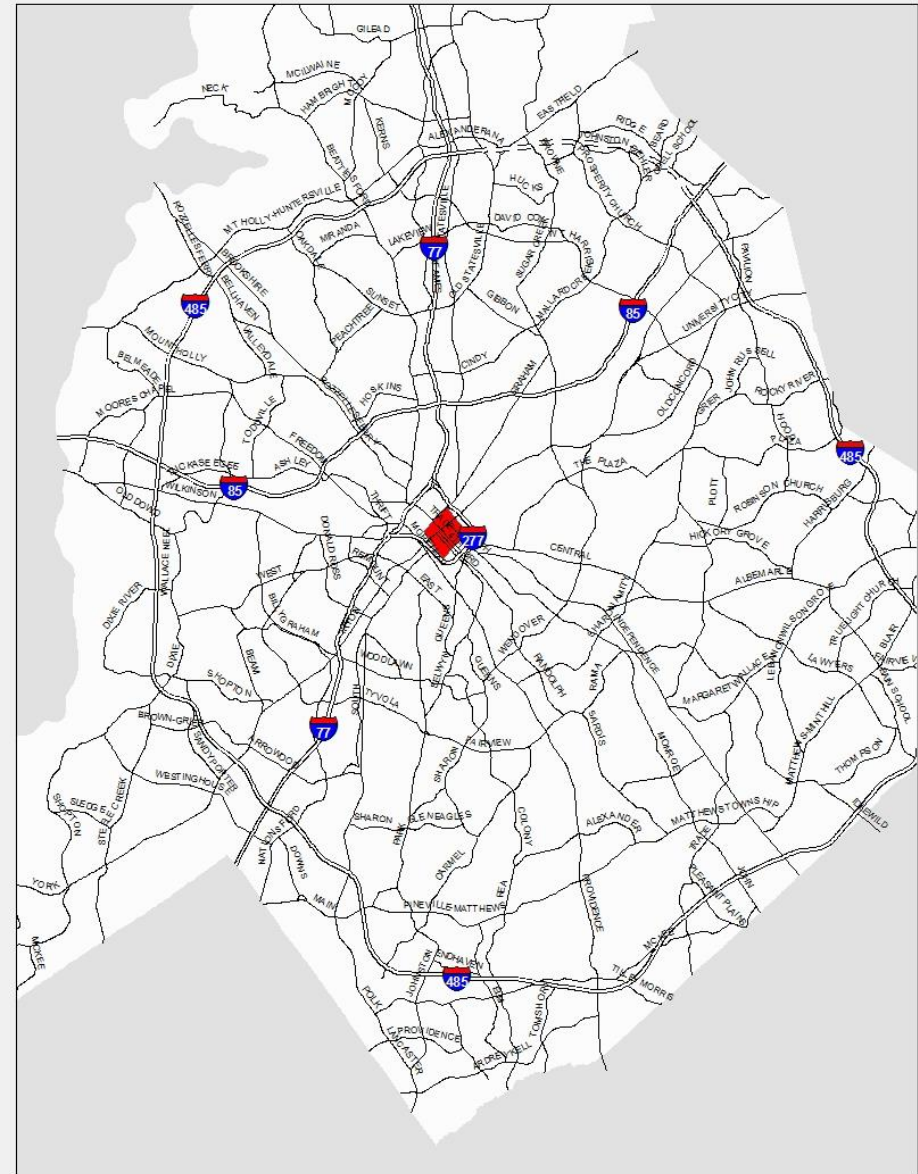

Charlotte's Growth - 1768

- Population: <500
- Land Area: 0.7 Square Miles

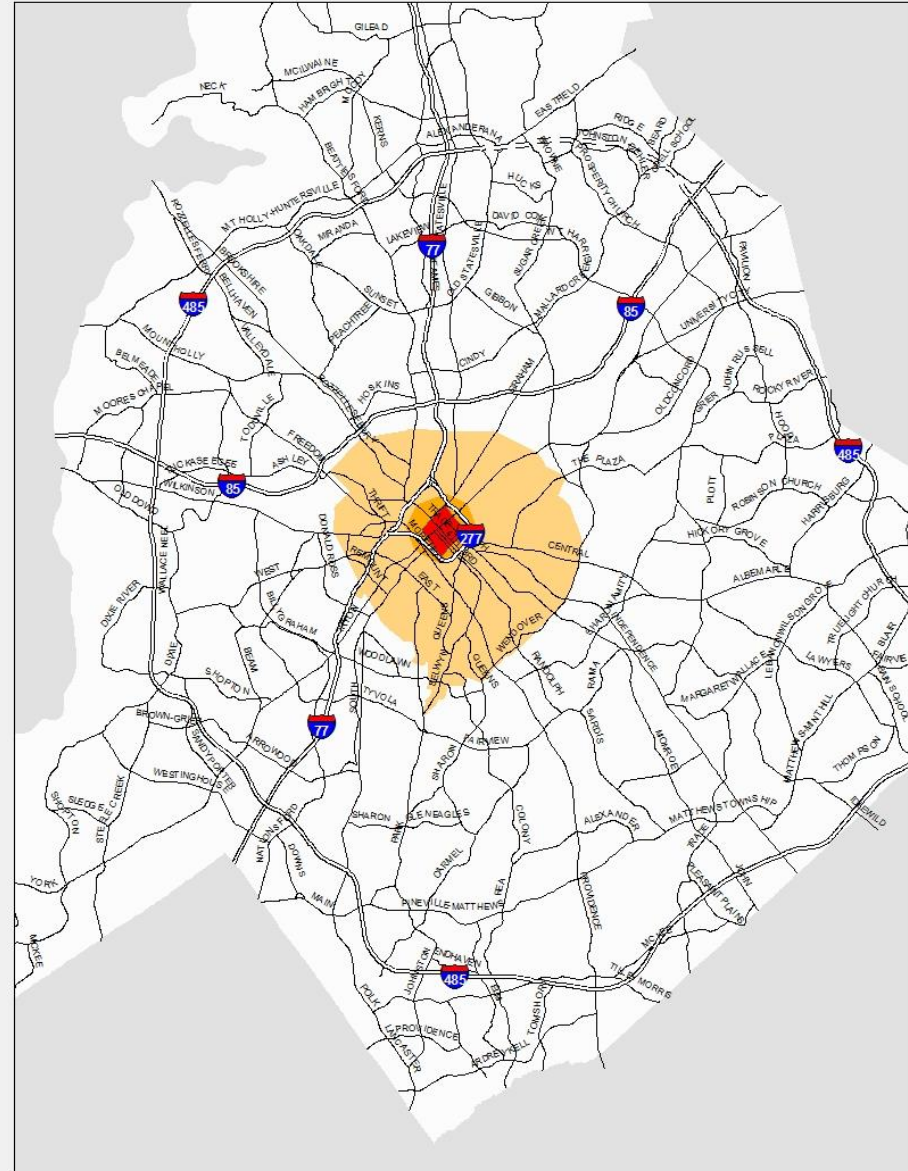
- **City first founded in 1768** and named after Queen Charlotte Sophia
- **Trade and Tryon** established as first streets and remaining area divided into **Four Wards**
- 1775 Mecklenburg County **Declaration of Independence** signed



Charlotte's Growth - 1949

- Population: 134,042
- Land Area: 29.8 Square Miles

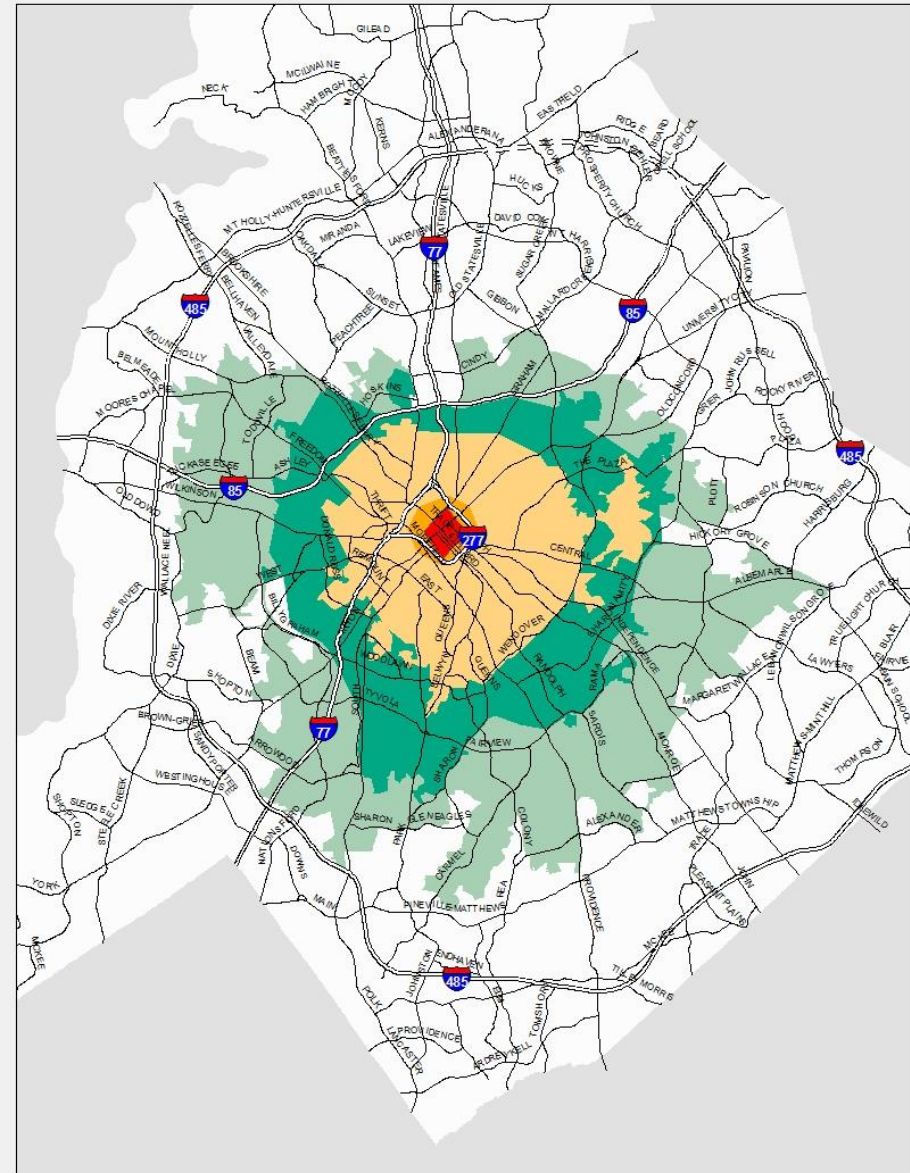
- Streetcar systems cease (1938)
- Independence Boulevard (1946)
- I-85 opens (1958)
- I-77 begins (1965)



Charlotte's Growth - 1979

- Population: 315,474
- Land Area: 140.7 Square Miles

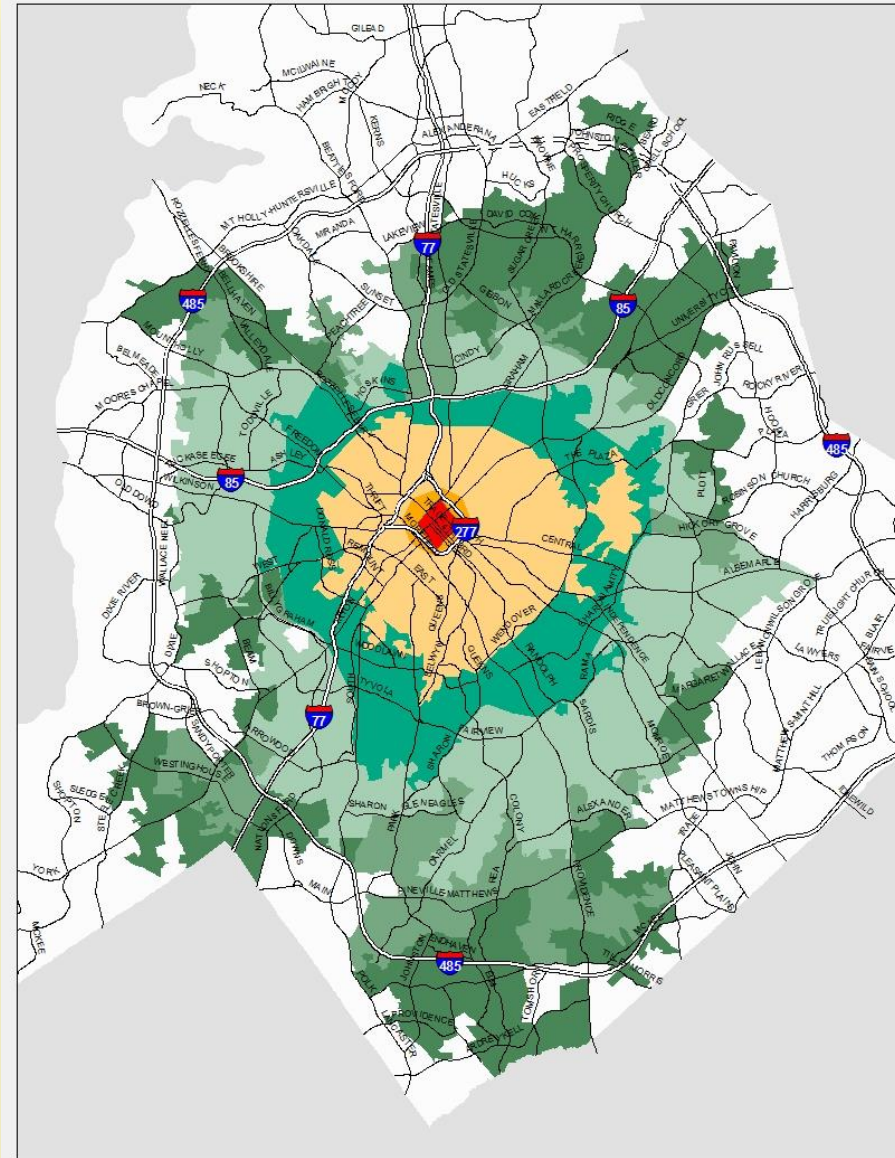
- **Brooklyn Village “urban renewal” (1961)**
- UNC-Charlotte opens in (1965)
- SouthPark mall opens (1970)
- 4th Ward revitalization begins (1975)
- Charlotte adds **100,000 new jobs** in 10 years.



Charlotte's Growth - 1999

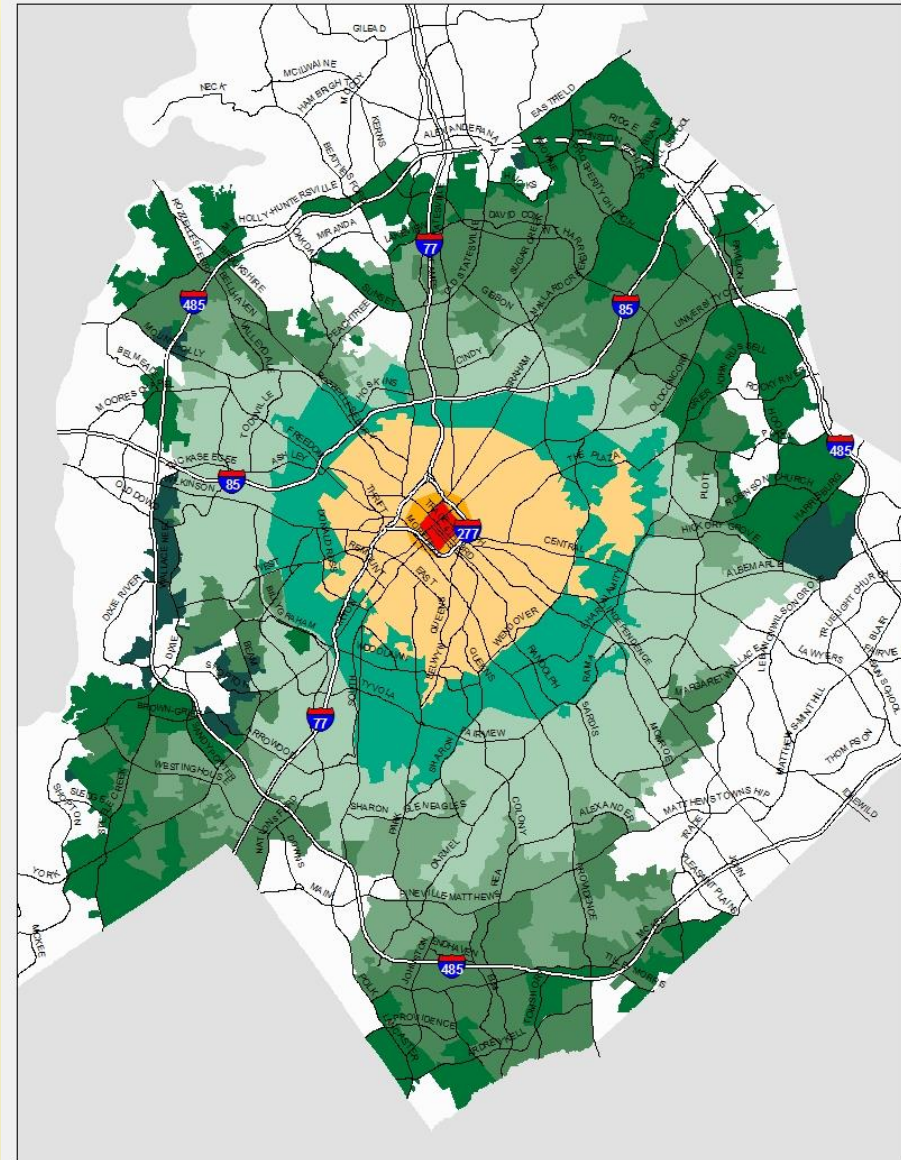
- Population: 540,828
- Land Area: 242.8 Square Miles

- **Hurricane Hugo (1989)**
- NationsBank Corporate Center opens (1992)
- New Charlotte Convention Center opens (1994)
- Panthers play their first home game (1996)
- Ballantyne construction begins (1996)
- **½ cent sales tax for transit passes (1998)**

- Increasingly **diverse economy**

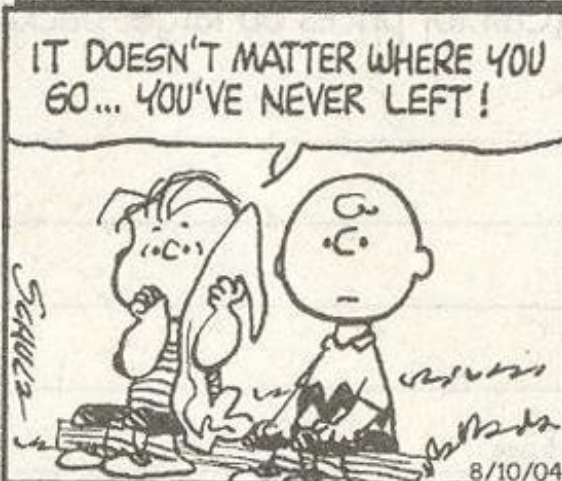

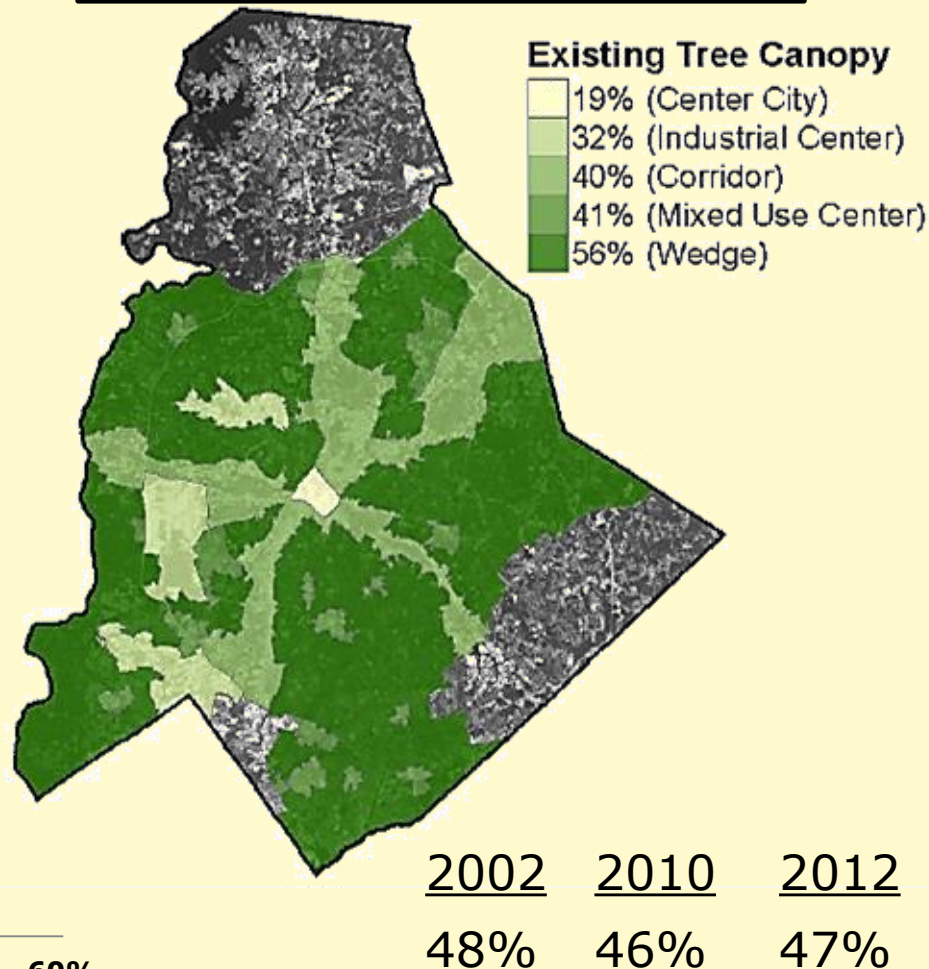
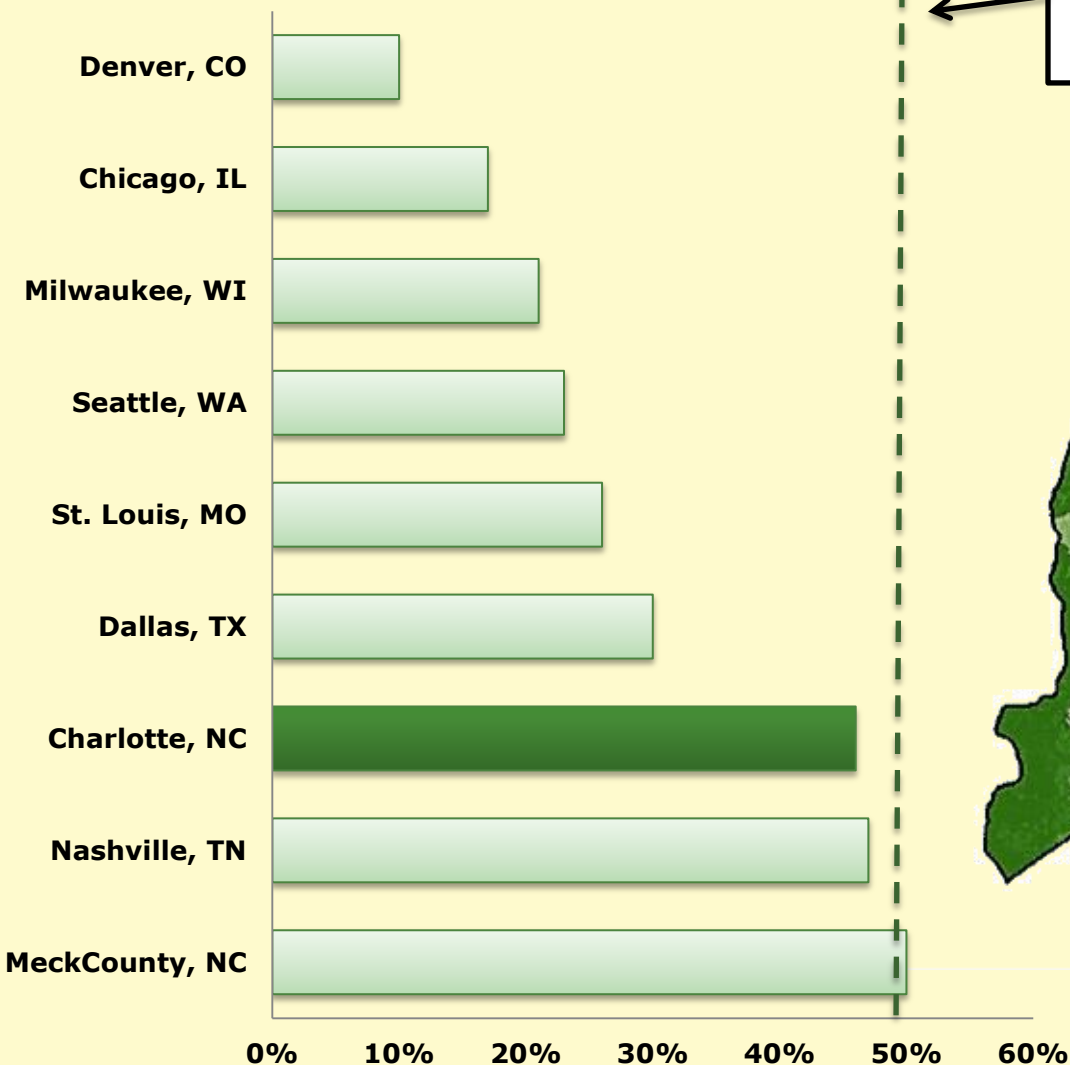

Charlotte's Tree Canopy Goal is to have 50% Tree Canopy by Year 2050





CFD responds to 98,000 incidents per year



CATS serves 79,000 riders per day



SWS - waste collection and recycling for almost 320,000 households



CDOT – Maintains 750 signals, 10,000 signs and 2,400 miles of paved roads



E&PM - 180 capital improvement projects & planting of 10,000 trees



CMPD – 1,800 officers, 34% reduction in crime over last 5 years



CMUD – 99 million gallons of drinking water and treats 72 million gallons of wastewater daily

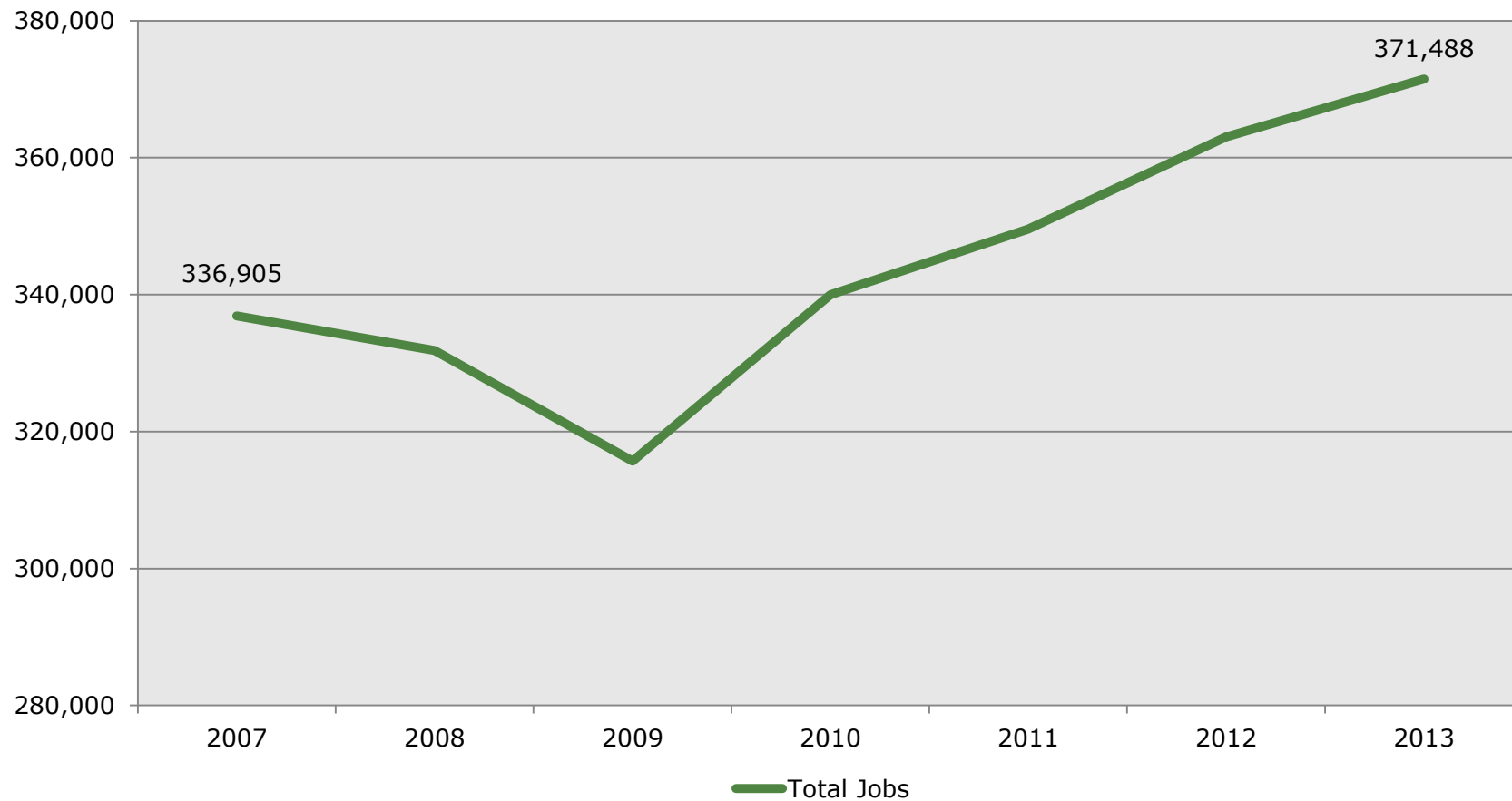

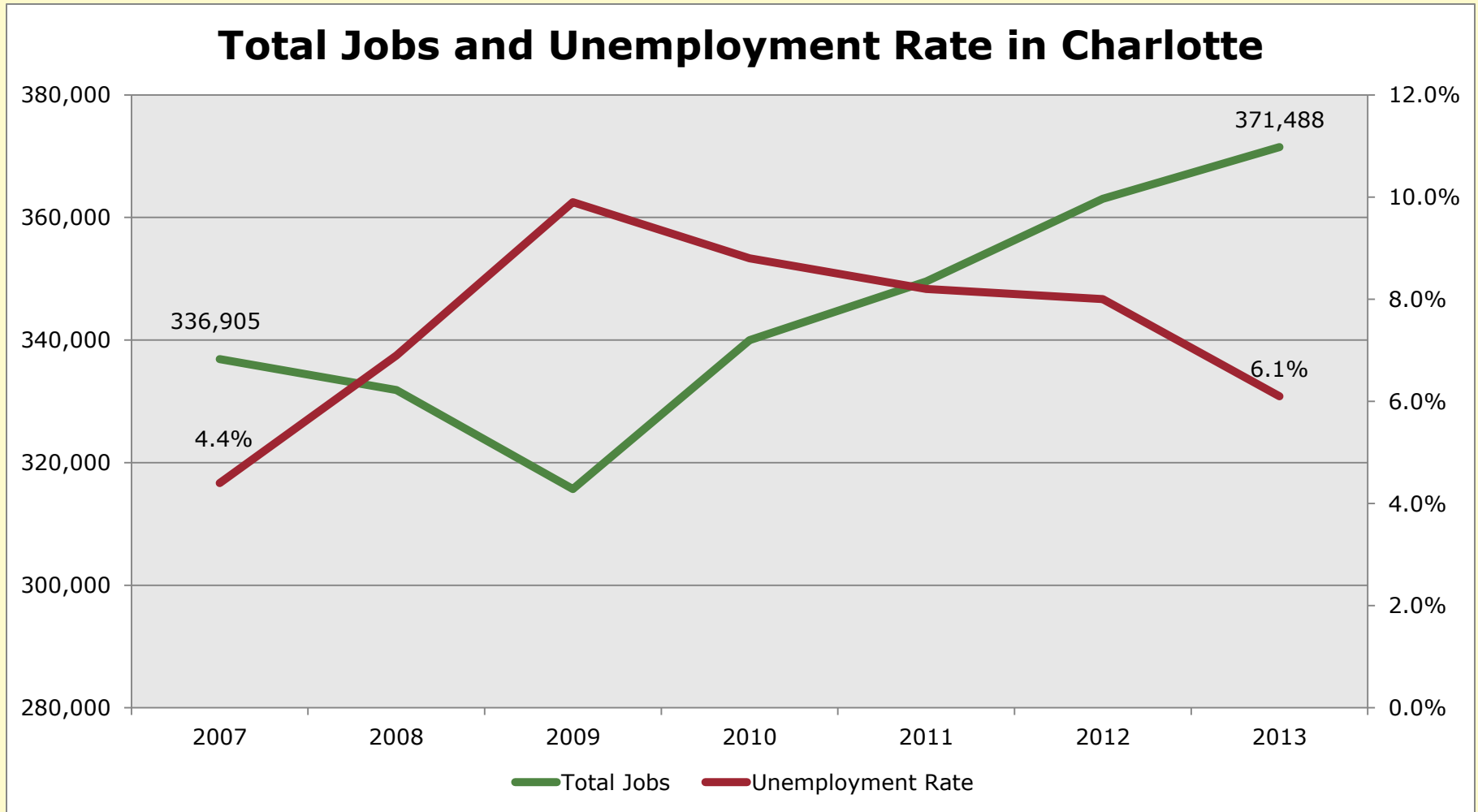

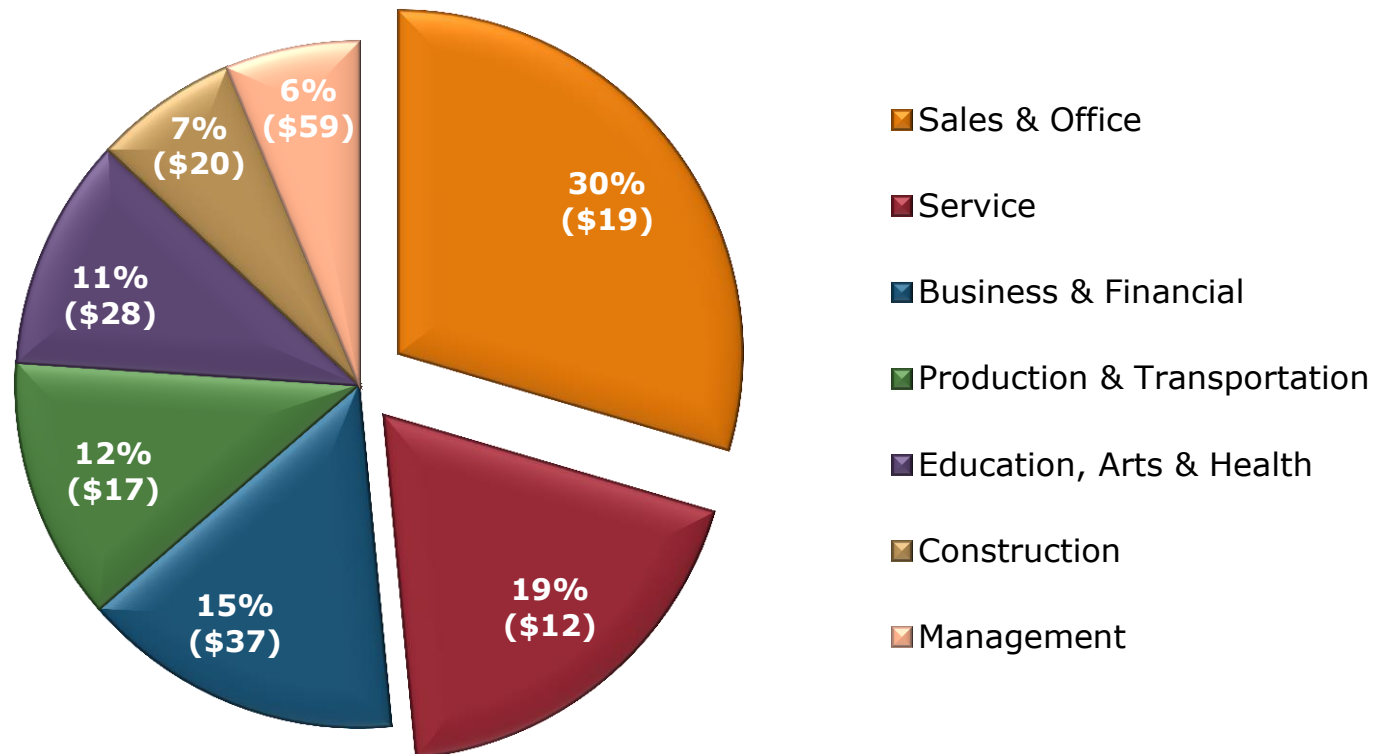
Job Growth and Unemployment

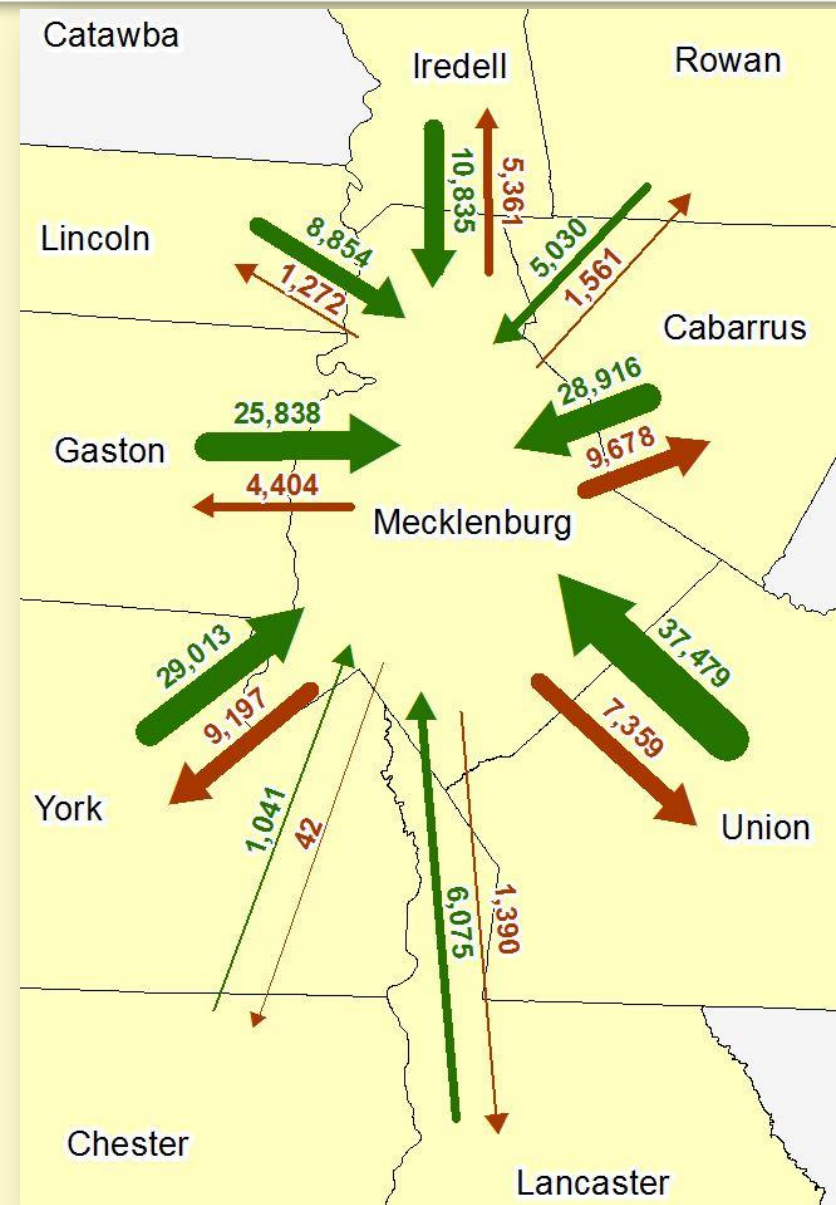
Occupations as Percent of Total Workforce and Average Hourly Wages in Mecklenburg County

- **1 in 3 jobs** held by someone who lives outside the County



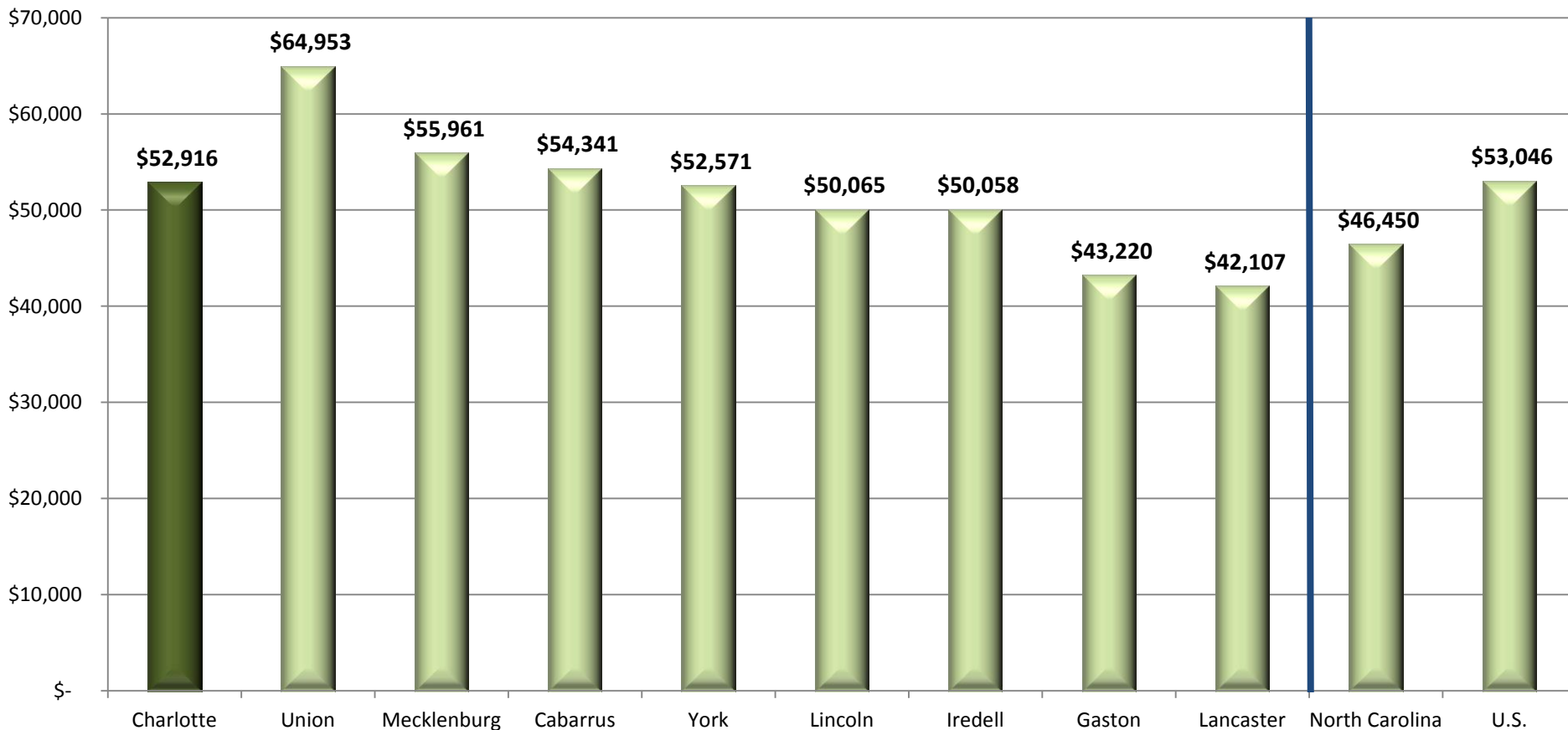

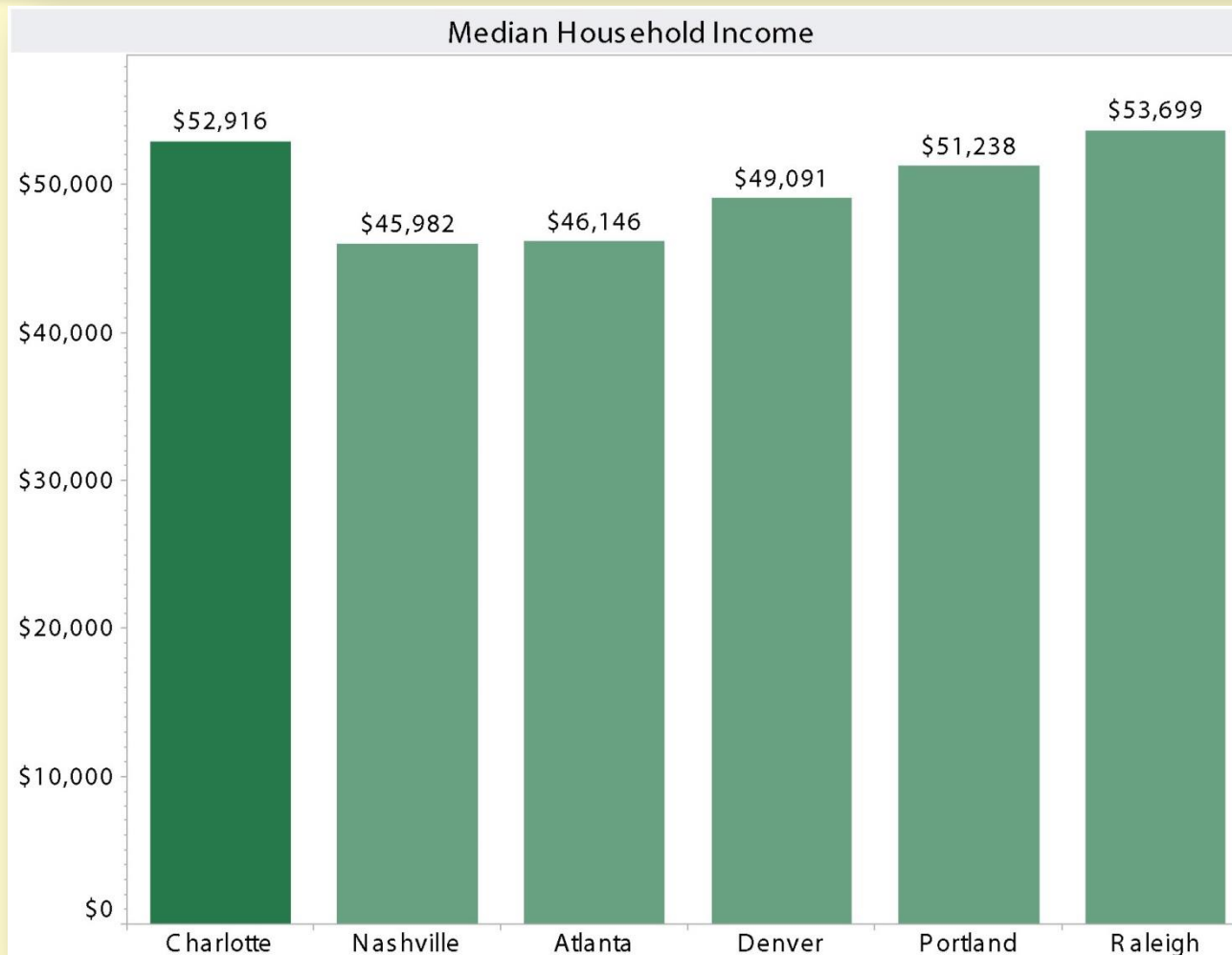
Median Household Income, 2012

Median Household Income: Charlotte and Peer Cities



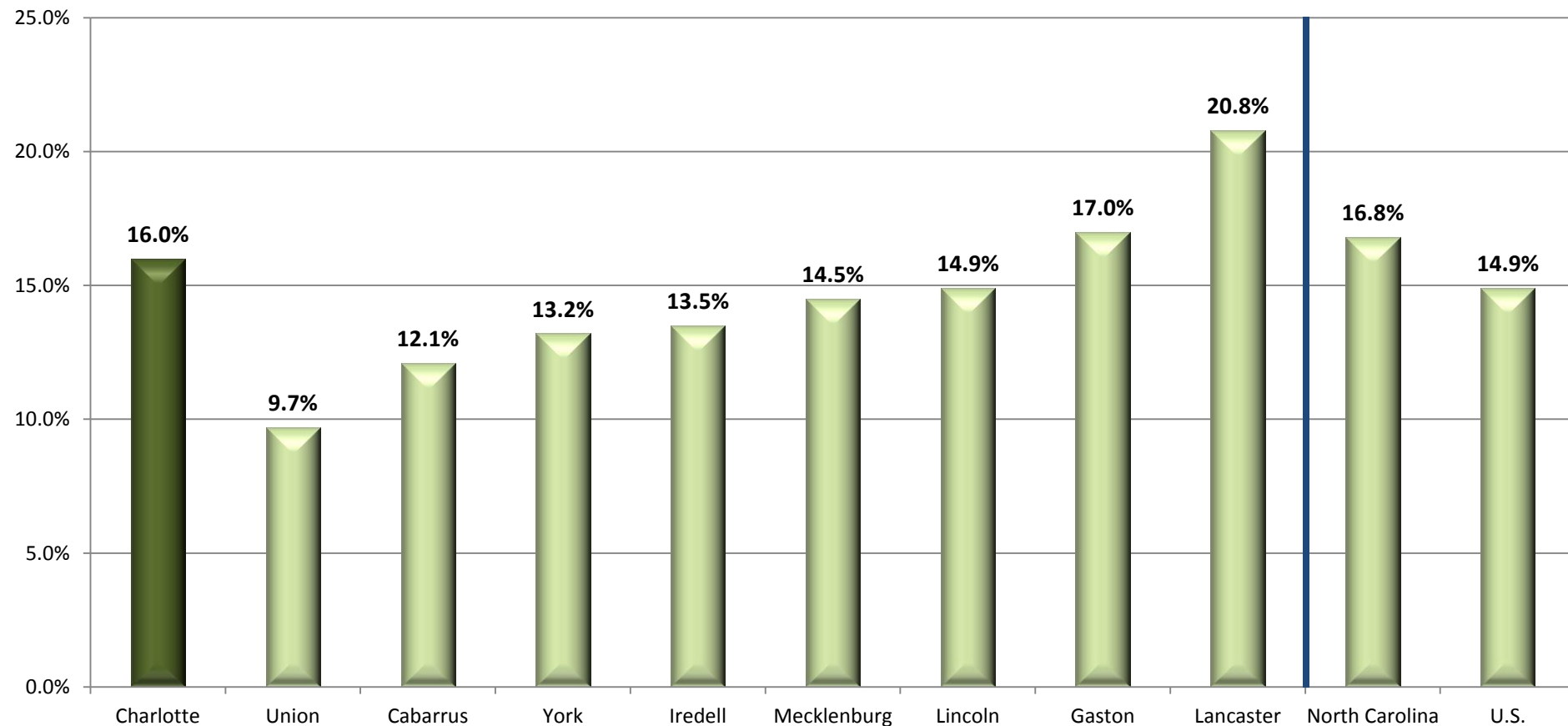

Percentage of Persons Below the Poverty Level

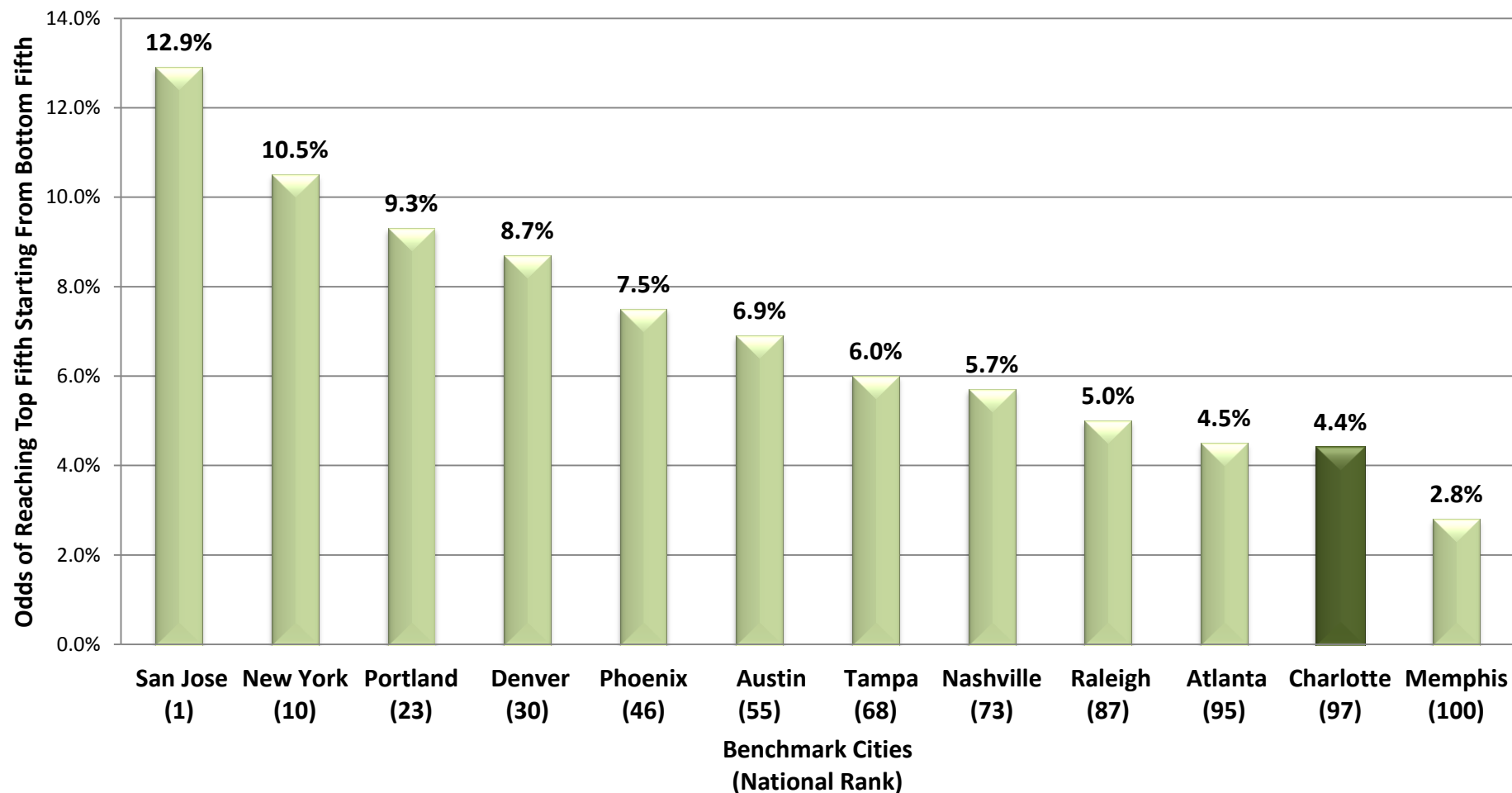
Percentage of Persons Below the Poverty Level, 2012

Income Mobility in the 100 Largest Commuting Zones



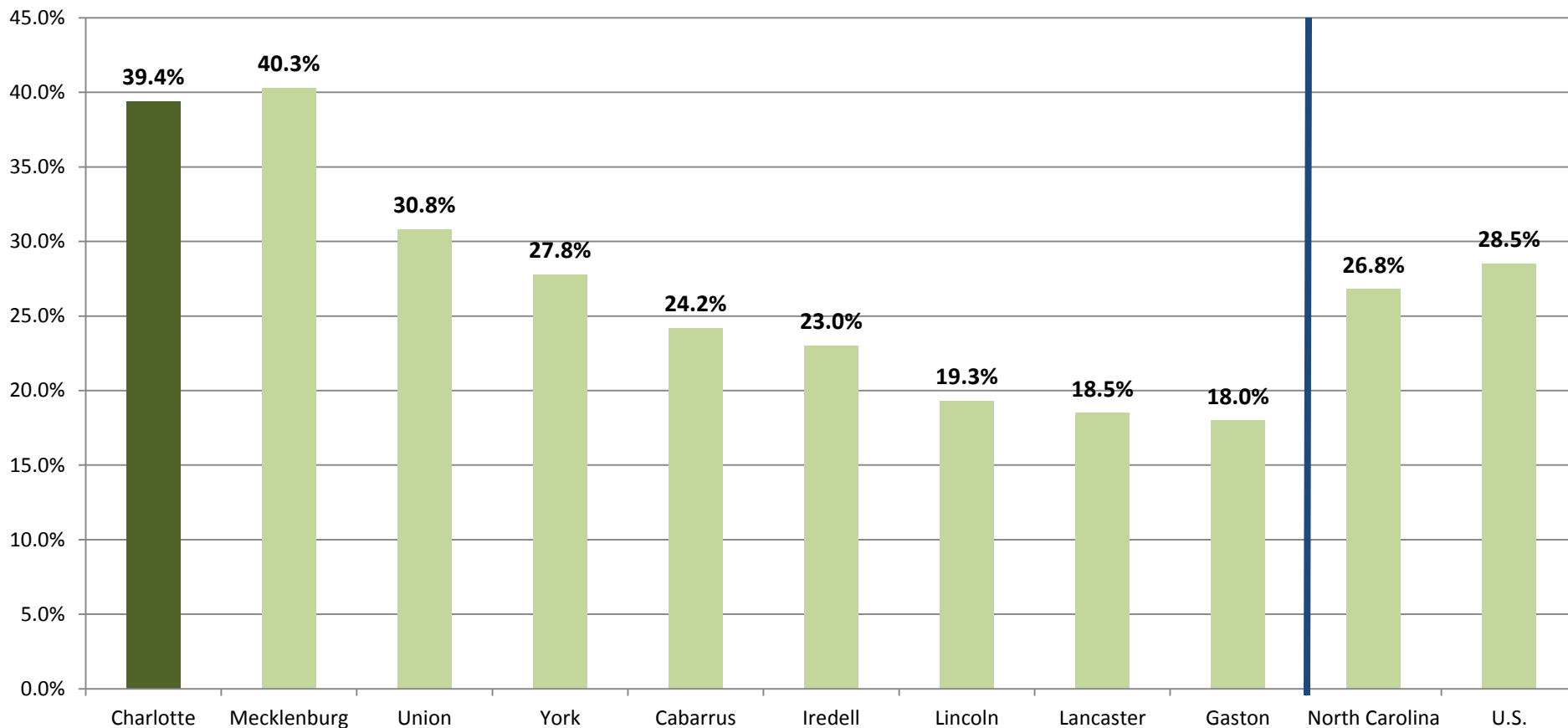

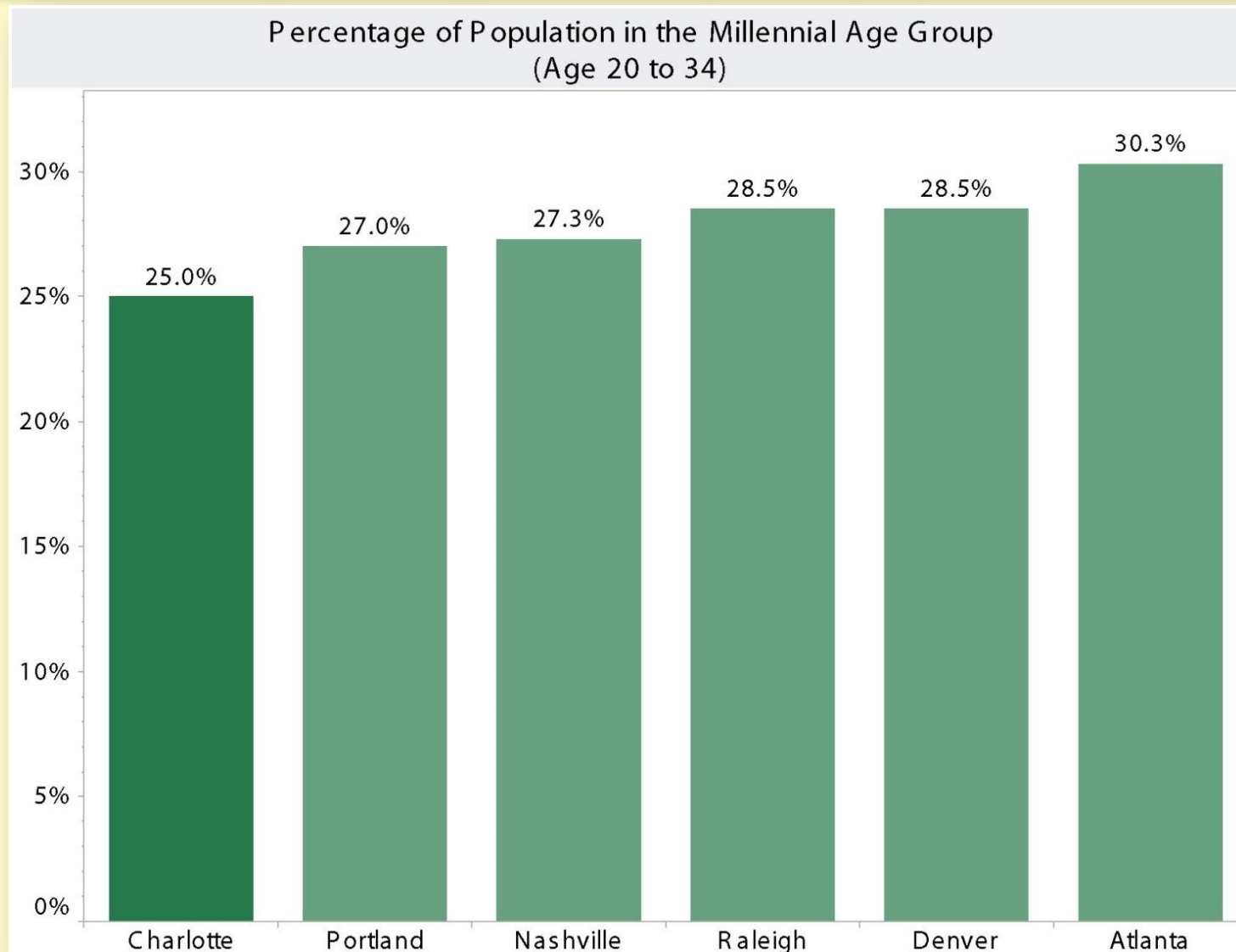
Percentage of Persons Age 25+ with Bachelor's Degrees or Higher

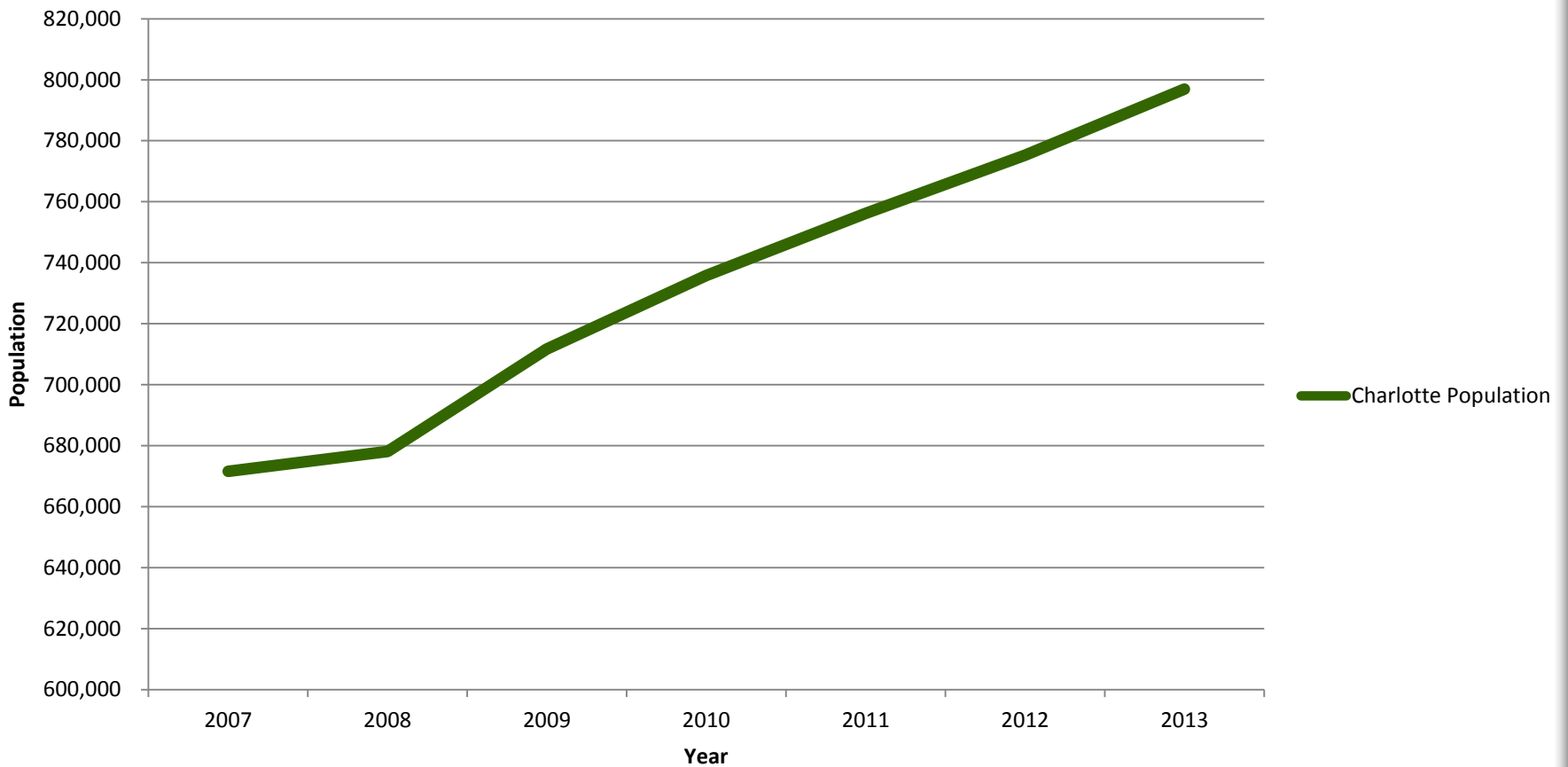

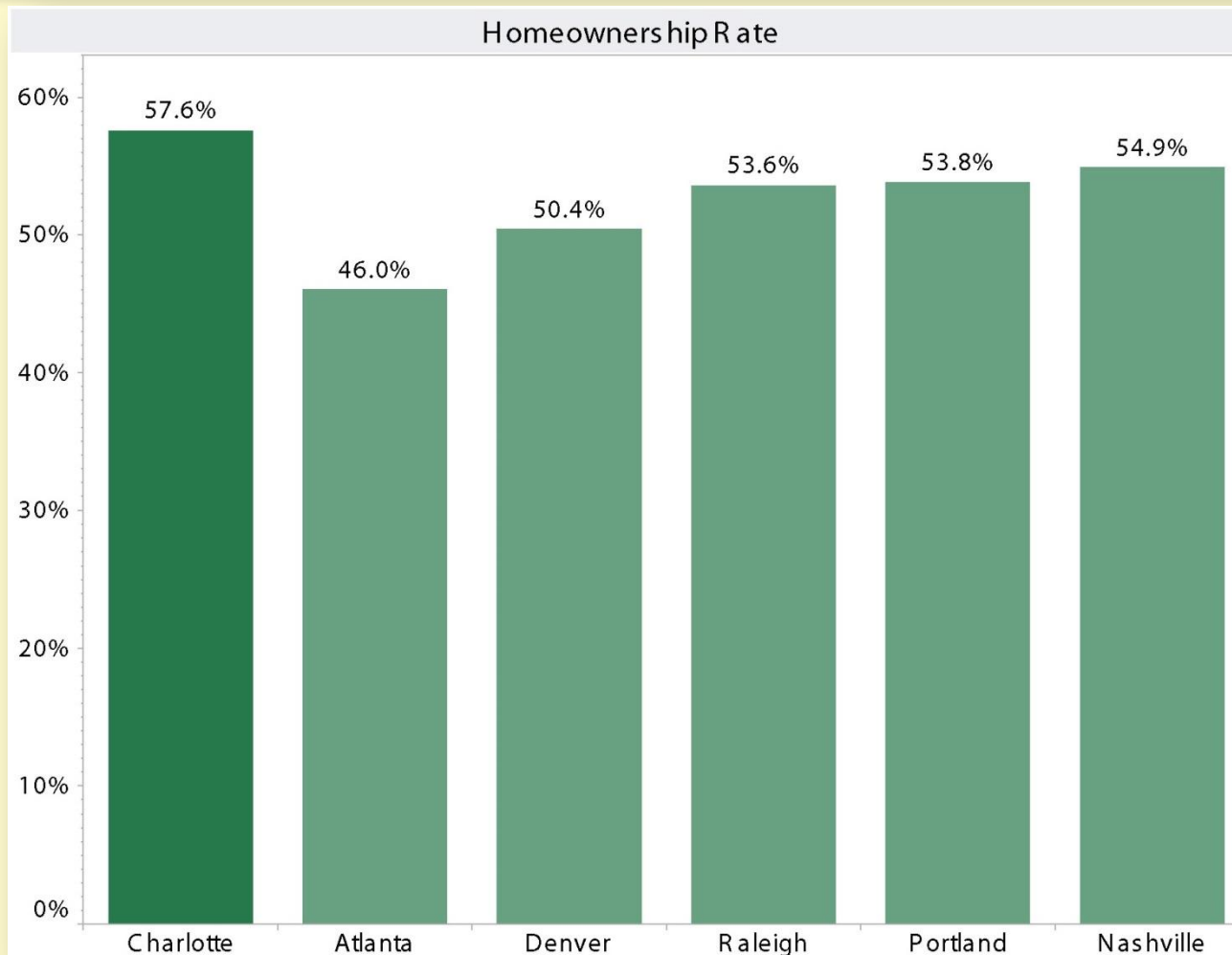
Population Growth, 2007-2013

Charlotte Population Growth, 2007-2013





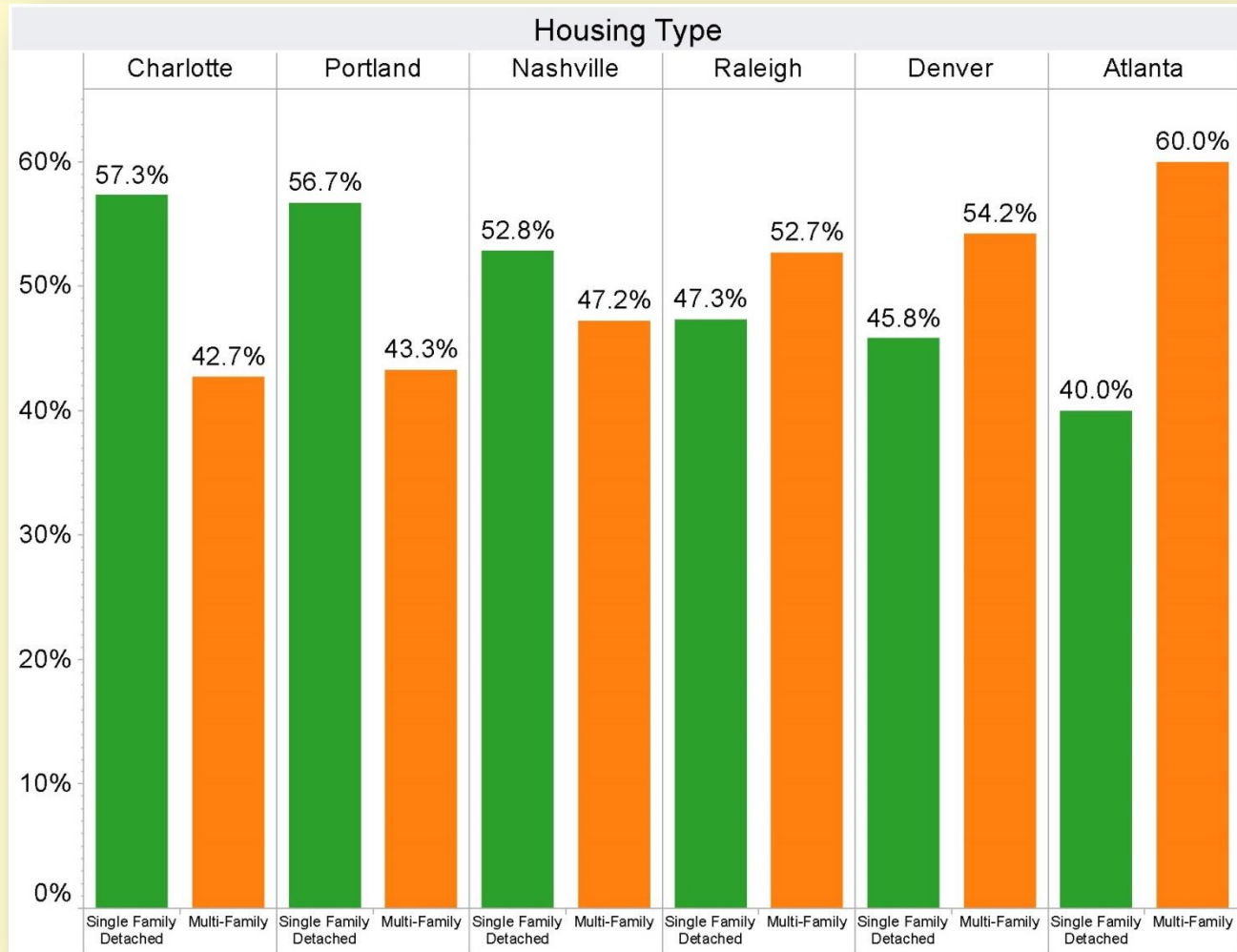
Homeownership Rate: Charlotte and Peer Cities

Housing Type: Charlotte and Peer Cities

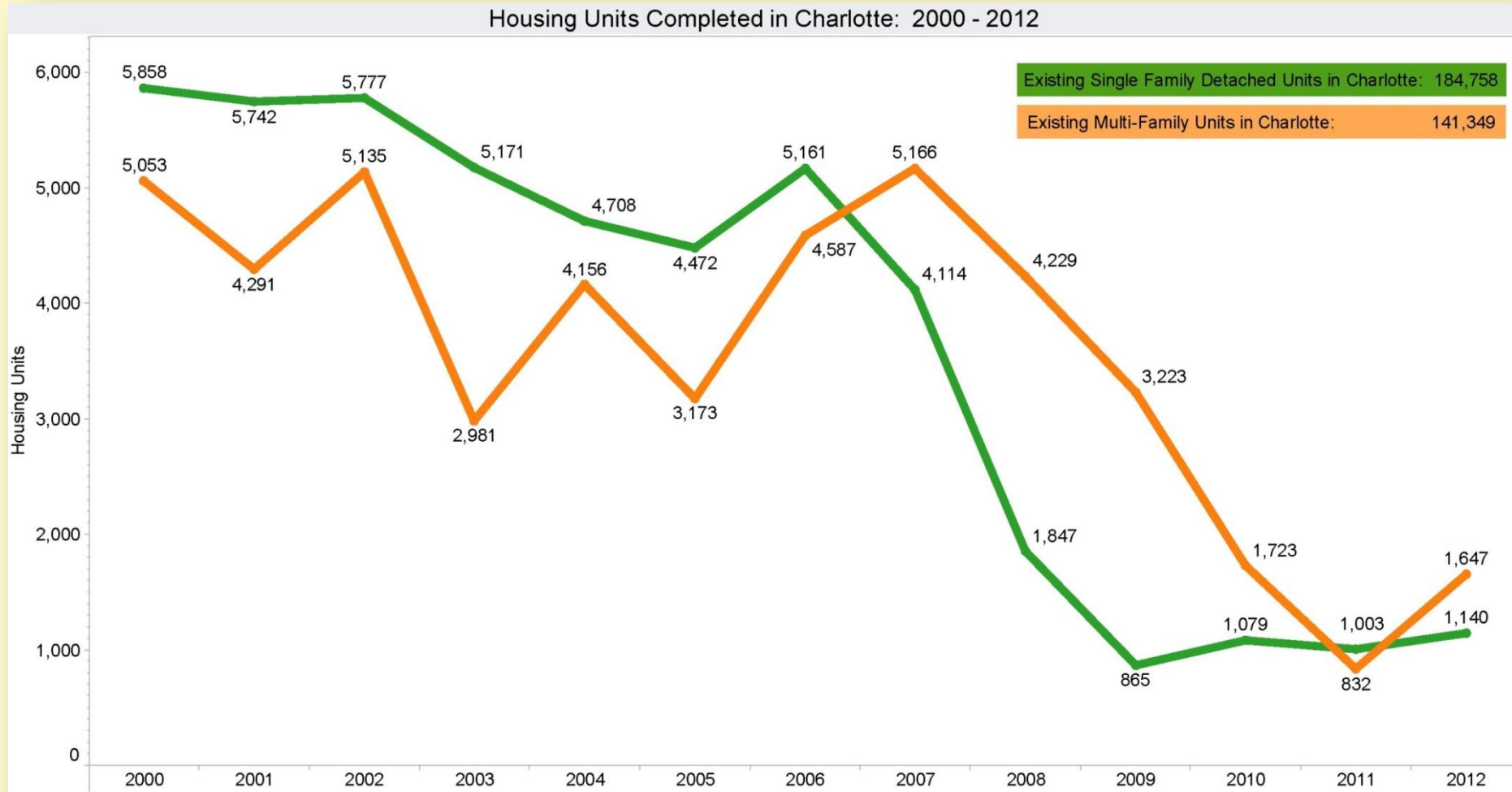


- Charlotte has the highest percentage of single family detached homes among five peer cities

Housing Units Built in Charlotte: 2000 to 2012

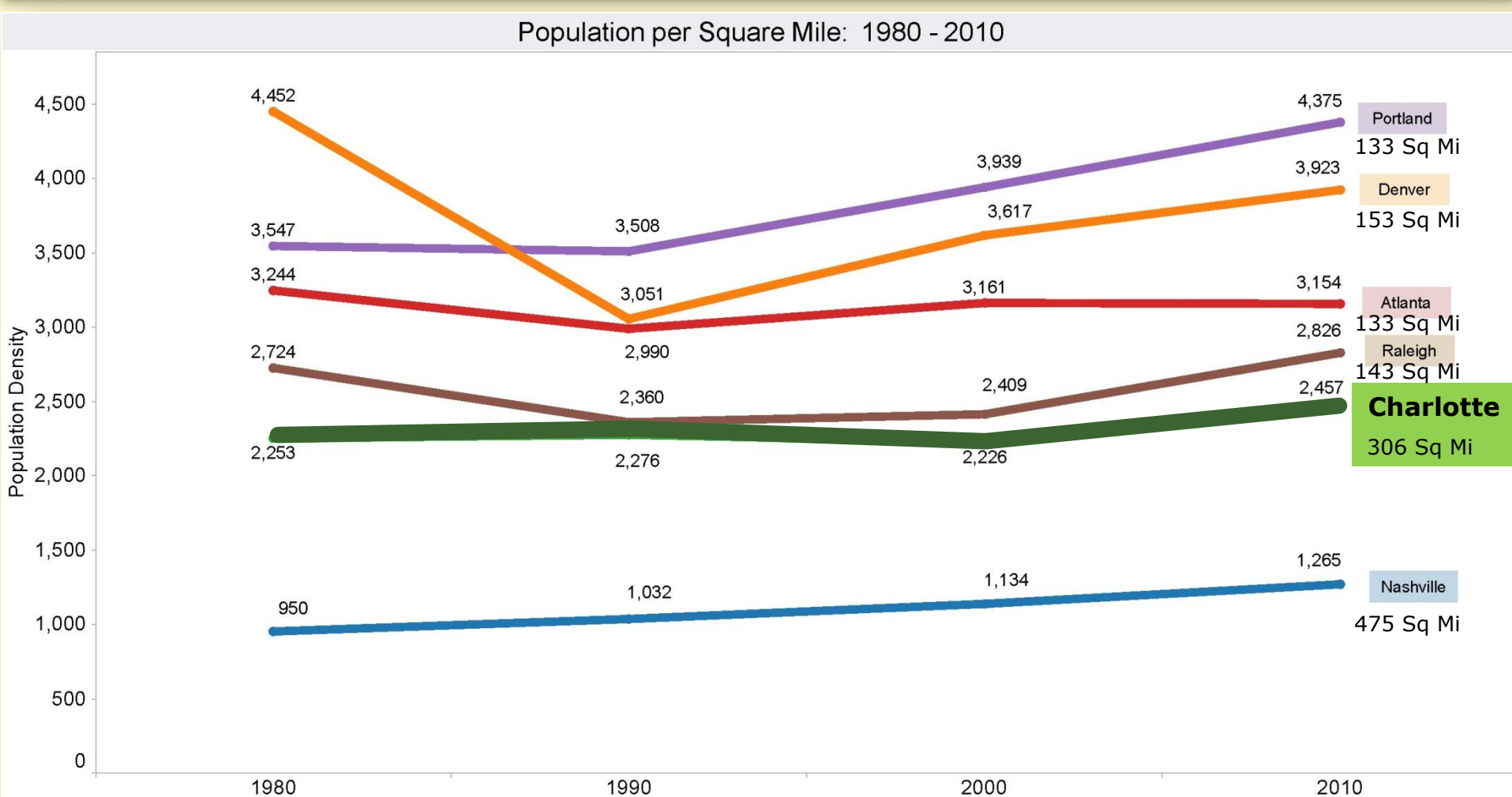


- Over **93,000 housing units** were constructed in Charlotte between 2000 and 2012 at a ratio of 50% Multi-Family and 50% Single Family.
- Since 2007 the construction ratio has been **63% Multi-Family** and **37% Single Family**.

- Charlotte's density will have to increase to **3,285 persons per square mile** to accommodate projected population growth by 2040.

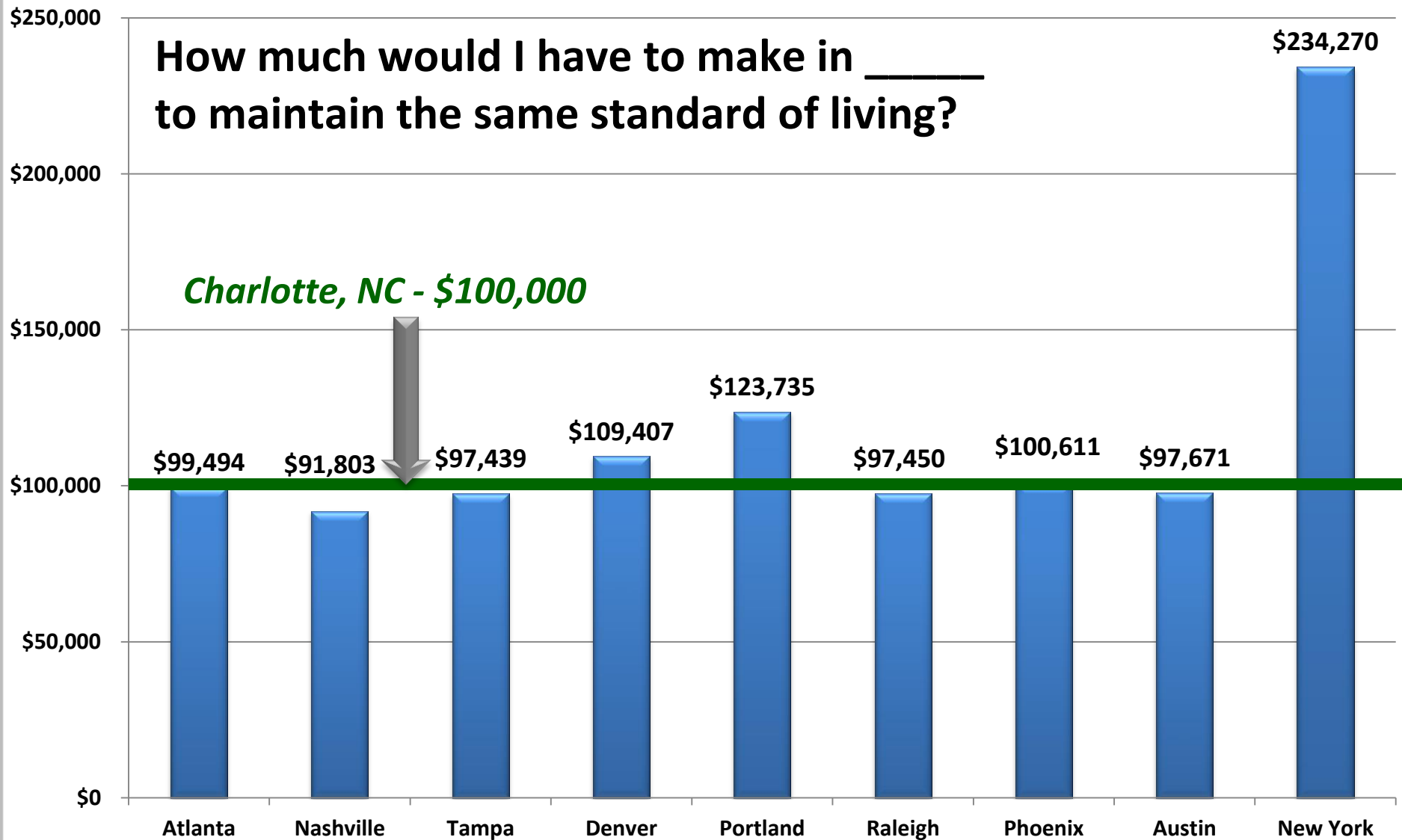

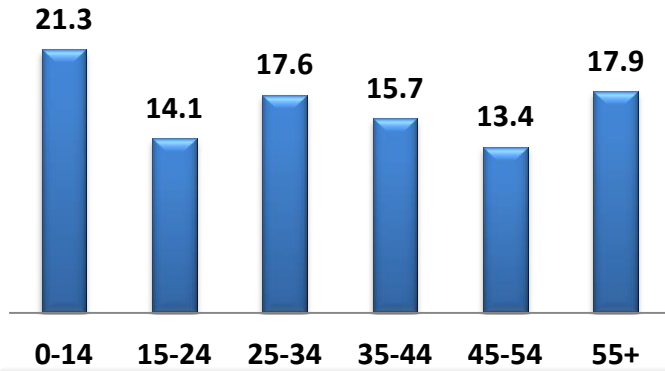

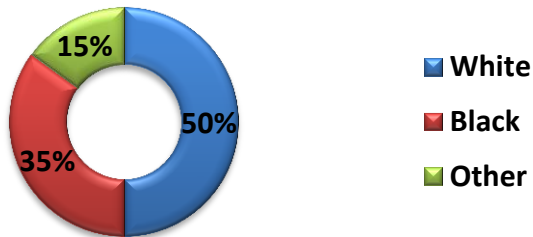

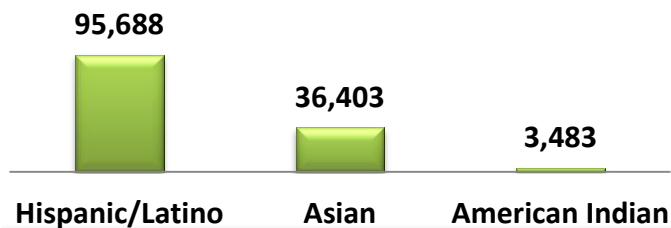
Percent of Population by Age Group



Racial Composition

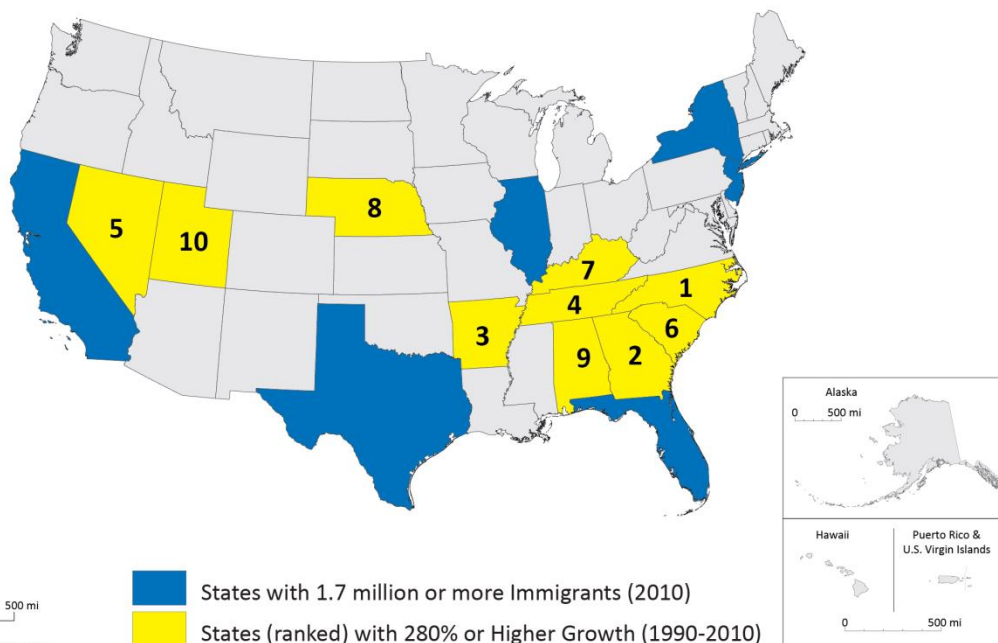

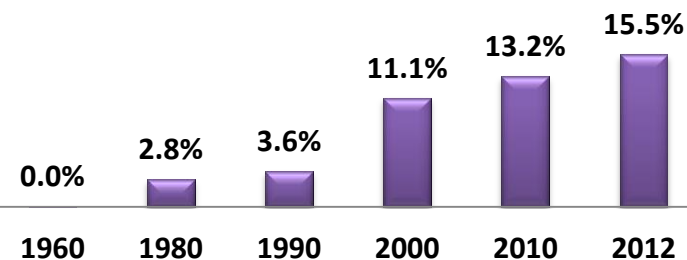
Charlotte as an Emerging Immigrant Gateway

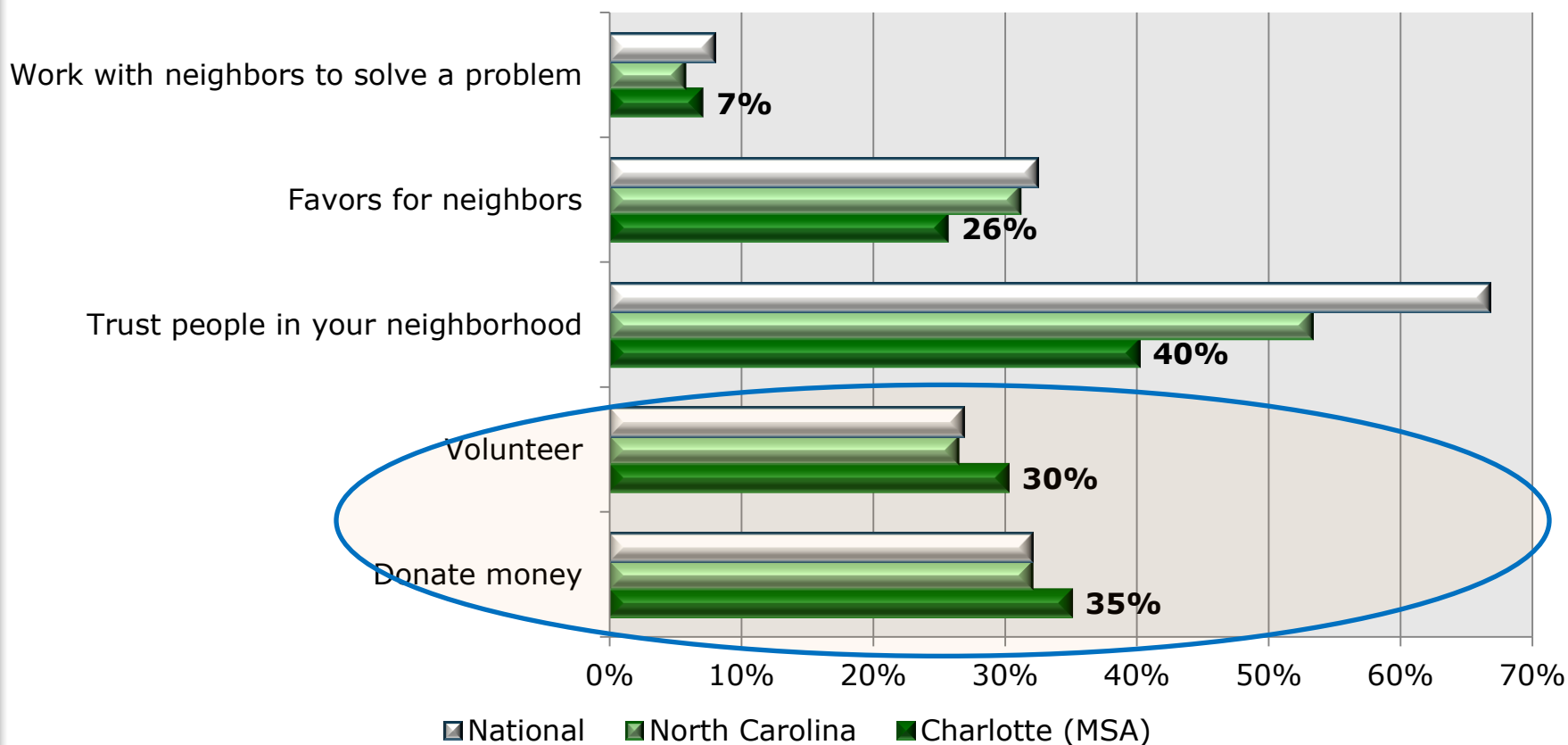

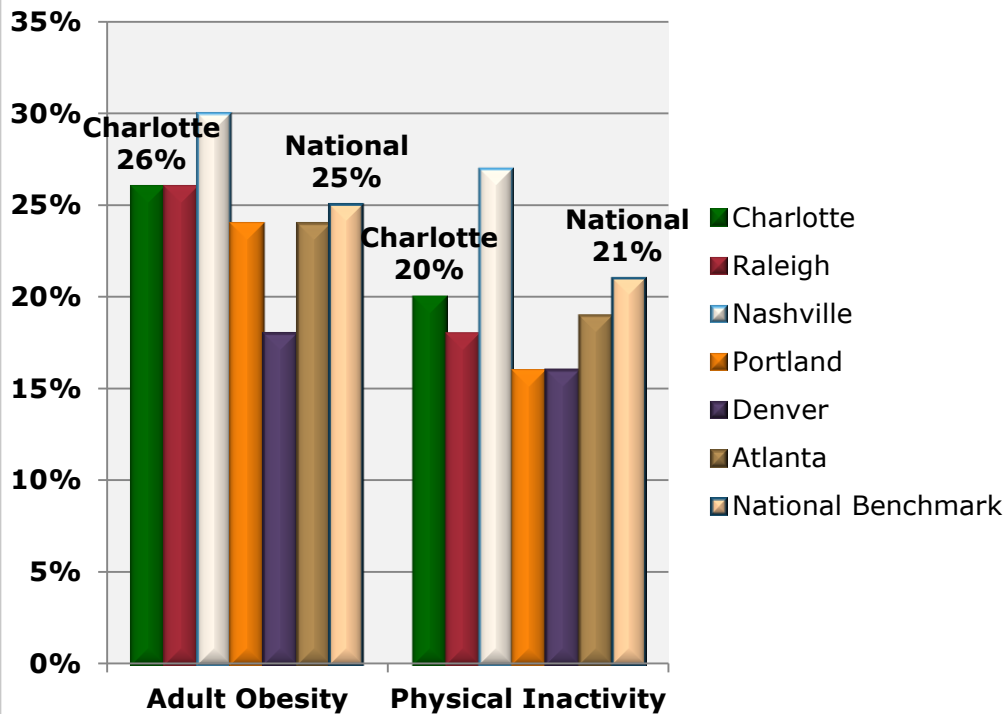

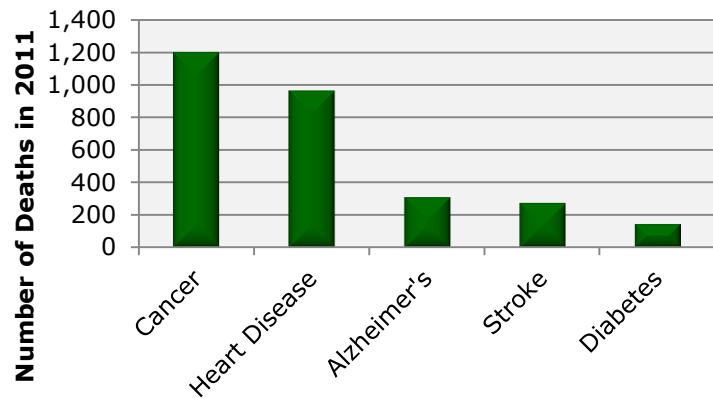

Health Risks in Charlotte and Peer Cities



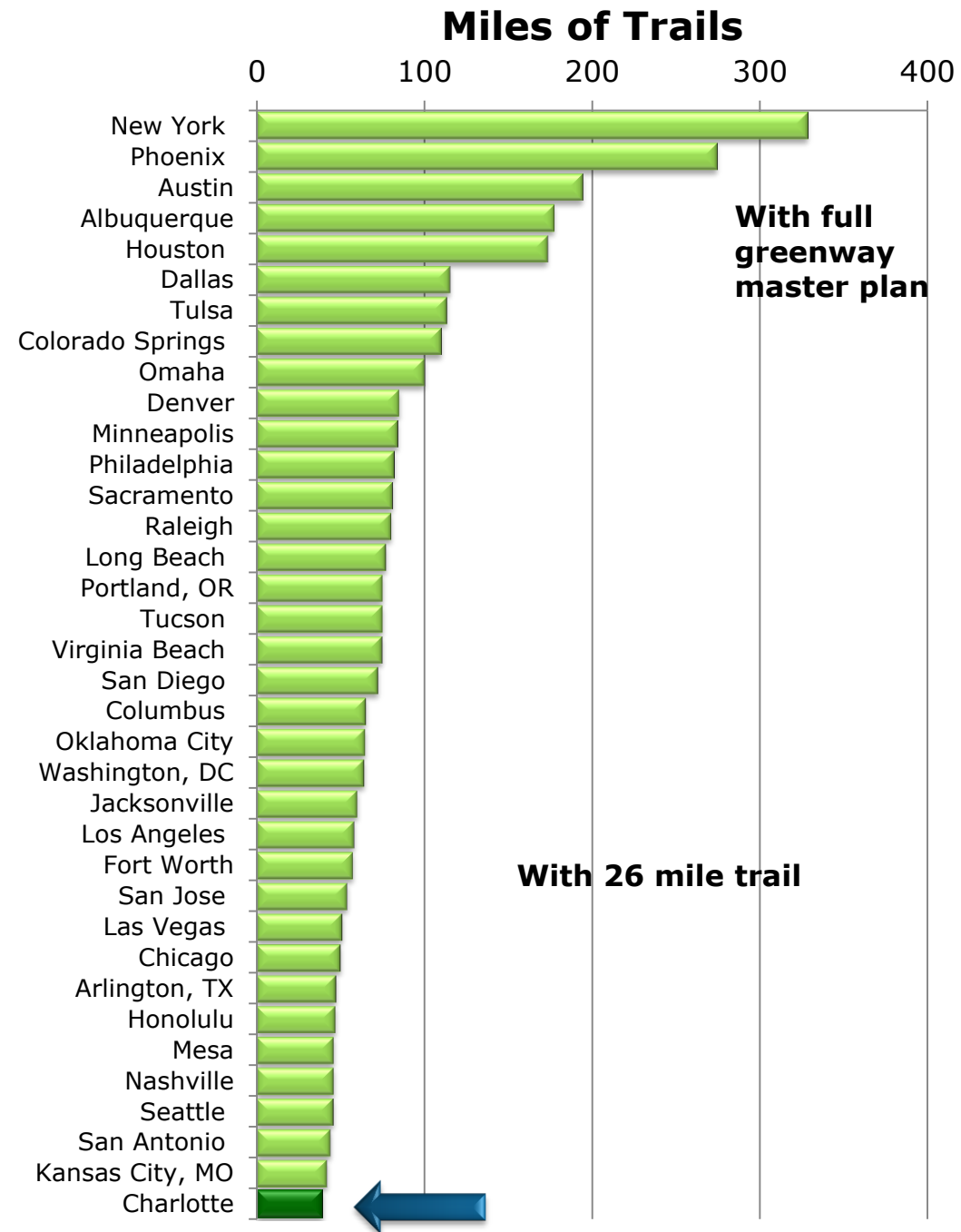

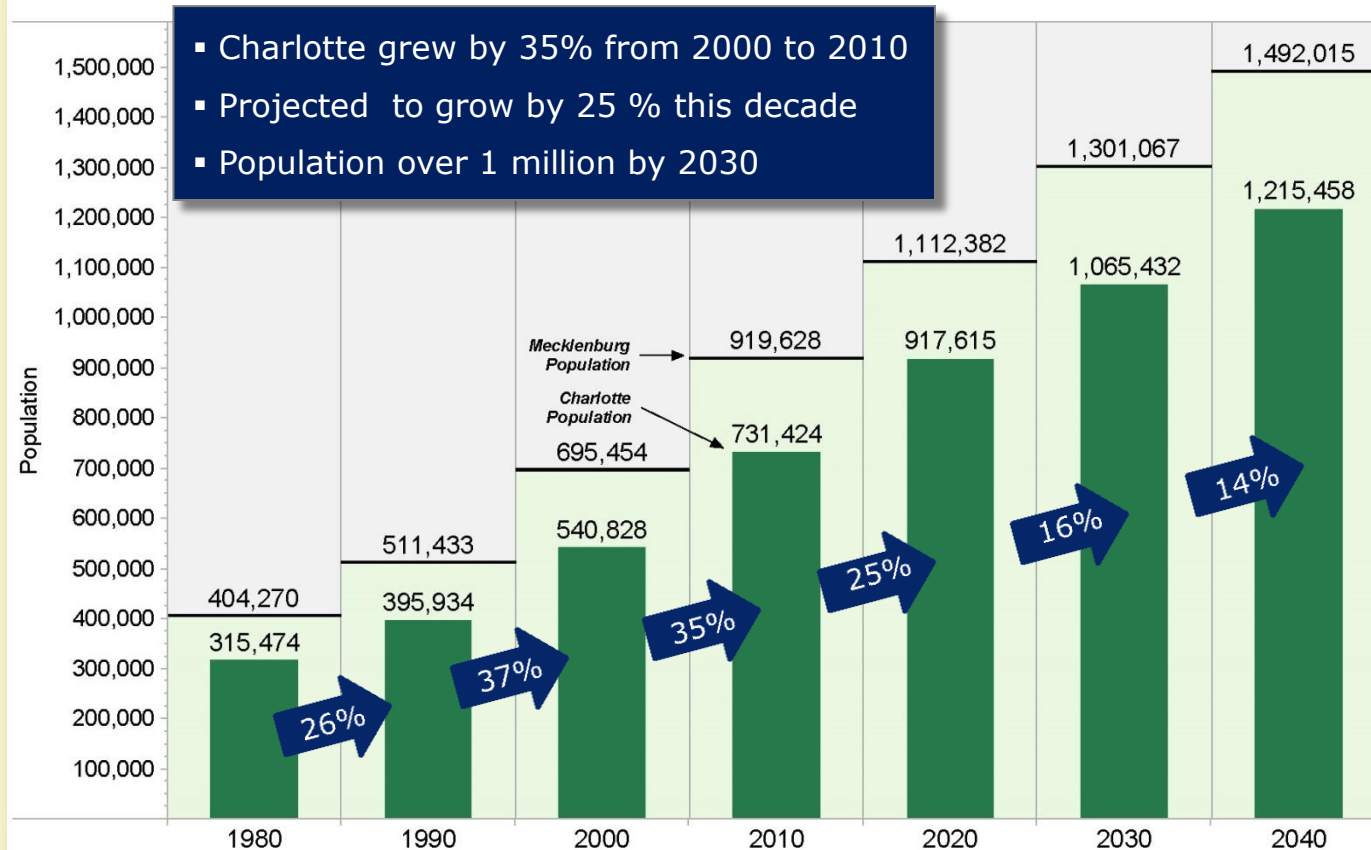
