- Planning Commission is committed to promoting affordability within our land use authority.
- Support Housing Trust Fund increase to \$50 million.
- Support work to reduce barriers, provide incentives, and protect existing and future affordable housing.

REDUCING BARRIERS



- "Prezone" City-owned sites for Affordable Housing permitting
 - Underway
 - Staff resources
- Reduce/eliminate fees for rezoning and permitting
 - Proposal stage
 - Financial implications





- Shorten Rezoning timeline for Affordable Housing
 - In process
 - Staff resources
 - Zoning Committee impact
- Rezoning petitions that include Affordable Housing not subject to monthly cap on petitions (currently 16 per month)
 - Proposal Stage
 - Staff Resources
- Provide greater flexibility in development regulations for affordable housing
- Additional housing types and update of standards for ADUs
 - Considered through Comp Plan and UDO






- Update sketch plan process for Housing Trust Fund projects

 - Complete
- Expand eligibility for Affordable Housing review process
 - Proposal stage
 - Staff resources



- Designate a Concierge for Affordable Housing projects - Rezoning and Permitting
 - Proposal stage
 - Staff resources
- Prioritize Affordable Housing to be first in permitting queue
 - Proposal Stage
 - Staff Resources



Providing Incentives


Explore new regulatory incentives

- TOD Districts to be adopted spring 2019
- Revise existing incentives 2019 (UDO Short-Term)
- New Regulatory Incentives Full UDO
- Review approach to consideration of Affordable Housing during rezoning process
 - Legal considerations/parameters
