

2025 Transit / Land Use Plan

- Vision for a long-term growth management strategy
- Integrates rapid transit and mixedused development along 5 transportation corridors
- Expands transit system to serve between the rapid transit corridors
- Provide more transportation choices to meet mobility needs
- Support sustainable growth for region
- Updated in 2006

Transit vehicles and services

BUS RAPID TRANSIT



- Intended for a variety of trips from regional to local
- Operates in a variety of ROW scenarios
- Service throughout the day and on weekends

STREETCAR



- Intended for shortdistance trips in urban areas
- Typically operates in mixed traffic
- Service throughout the day and on weekends

LIGHT RAIL



- Intended for a variety of trips from regional to local
- Typically operates in dedicated ROW
- Service throughout the day and on weekends

COMMUTER RAIL



- Intended for longerdistance commute trips from suburbs into a central city
- Operates in dedicated ROW
- Service during peak hours of travel M-F




LYNX SYSTEM MAP










LYNX Silver Line


- MTC approved recommendation of light rail LPA in November 2016
- 13-15 miles long
- 13 stations with 8-10 park and ride locations
- Identified possible extensions to the West
- Center City alignments to be considered as part of LYNX System Update.





Independence Boulevard

- Originally constructed in 1950 the roadway was North Carolina's first urban expressway.
- Suburban communities quickly developed along the spine.
- Commercial strip retail and entertainment facilities quickly developed.






Independence Boulevard

The conversion of Independence Boulevard from a commercial arterial into a limited-access expressway has changed the character of the surrounding land uses











North Corridor Staff Recommendation

Short Term


- Village Rider and Express bus stop amenity improvements
- Continued express lane bus service improvements as recommended in the North Corridor Mobility Study and Envision My Ride

Medium Term

- Implementation of an I-77 Bus Rapid Transit service from Charlotte Gateway Station to Mooresville to include:
 - All day service including nights and weekends
 - Four new park and rides and two new express lane direct connects
 - Integrated BRT stations into mixed use developments that also incorporate emerging mobility technologies for first/last mile.

Long Term

 Continue dialogue with Norfolk Southern on use of the "O" Line corridor for a Rapid Transit project





BRT Example

Flatiron Flyer BRT on US 36 in Colorado Denver to Boulder



- 6 stations
- 6 routes
 - Some express
 - Some serve all stations
 - Some stop on–street in Boulder and downtown Denver
- Frequent peak service
- Off-peak service all day, nights, and weekends
- Branded coach buses













I-77 BRT – Types of Stations








West Corridor Staff Recommendation

- Light rail replace streetcar as the West Corridor Transit Mode.
- Wilkinson Blvd as the light rail alignment including planning for rail trail
- West Corridor be included in the LYNX Silver Line project
- Extend light rail across the Catawba River to the City of Belmont
- As part of the Regional Transit Study, evaluate light rail to downtown Gastonia
- Implement enhanced bus services and bus stop capital improvements along West Blvd and Freedom Drive








Time is of the essence for selecting a preferred Center City transit approach.


Silver Line and Brookshire Freeway








Silver Line and Charlotte Gateway












Regional TOD Grant Partnership

CATS in partnership with Charlotte Planning, Design + Development Department, City of Gastonia, City of Belmont, Town of Matthews, Town of Stallings, and Town of Indian Trail were awarded a planning grant for TOD planning from the Federal Transit Administration.






Specific outcomes of this work will include:

- Determining future land use around stations
- Identifying supporting infrastructure
- Advance actions for corridor preservation and affordable housing
- Identifying innovative economic development and financing strategies



Pineville/Ballantyne Staff Recommendation


- During the LYNX System Update and the Regional Transit Engagement Series there was significant interest in rapid transit to Pineville and Ballantyne
- CATS recommends continuing the LYNX System Update study to evaluate rapid transit options including a light rail extension to the Town of Pineville and the community of Ballantyne





Advancing the System Plan

- Provides additional transportation choice
- Provides access to economic opportunities
- Must be coordinated with affordable housing goals
- Creates a framework for growth
- Increases regional economic competitiveness
