### **Details of Proposed Request**

This application is for a plan to replace the existing wooden screening walls at this condominium complex with new brick screening walls as shown on the attached plans. These areas are primarily internal to the development, but are somewhat visible in places, particularly from Cleveland Avenue.

## Current Status and Context of Property

This condominium project was constructed in 1984, just after the original designation of the Dilworth Local Historic District. It is in an area that is a mixture of larger scale homes from the 1910's and 1920's, as well as a considerable amount of later infill residential and commercial development. There are three adjacent individually designated Mecklenburg County Landmarks.

## **Relevant Secretary of Interior's Standards for Historic Rehabilitation**

(As cited in the Charlotte Zoning Ordinance Section 10.210)

The new work shall be differentiated from the old and shall be compatible with the massing, size, scale, and architectural features to protect the historic integrity of the property and its environment.
- (j) New additions and adjacent or new construction shall be undertaken in such a manner that if removed in the future, the essential form and integrity of the historic property and its environment would be unimpaired.
