Details of Proposed Request

This application requests approval for the removal of three large pine trees and the replacement of those trees with maples and laurel trees. This replacement is proposed for a small island at the entrance of the perking area behind this building on the Euclid Avenue side of this corner lot. The proposal also includes the removal of the holly bushes in this island with nandinas or loro petalums.

Current Status and Context of Property

This building, originally a small residential apartment building, is a commercial property facing East Boulevard at its intersection with Euclid Avenue. It is surrounded by commercial uses in buildings of varying scales and vintages. This two story brick structure was constructed in 1928, and is listed as a Contributing Structure within the Dilworth National Register Historic District.


(As cited in the Charlotte Zoning Ordinance Section 10.210)
