DETAILS OF APPROVED PROJECT: Rear Addition: 6'x8' rear stoop will be covered with a gabled roof. Stoop foundation is brick as well as the steps and the new floor will be set stone. The new gable will tuck into the line of the rear facing primary gable. Roof will be supported by 8"x8" wooden columns trimmed out at the top and bottom. Wooden rail around stoop will be trimmed out with a hand piece (two layer) and toe piece. Rail balusters will dye into horizontal members at the top and bottom. See Exhibit labelled 'Rear Elevation – March 2014'. Notes on plans taken from Email dated March 17, 2014 from Myron Greer to Wanda Birmingham. Materials and details (including soffit/fascia treatment, overhang, rail, etc.) will match existing. Landscape plan shows plan view of new stoop and does not represent approval of anything else – See Exhibit labelled 'Landscape Plan – March 2014'. Approval of any substitute material is not implied. This addition being neither taller nor wider, is Staff Approved.

- > This Certificate of Appropriateness indicates that this project proposal has been determined to comply with the standards and policies of the Charlotte Historic District Commission.
- > No other approvals are to be inferred.
- No demolition other than that specifically indicated on any attached plans is authorized under this approval.
- All work must be completed in accordance with all other applicable state and local codes.
- Any changes from or additions or deletions to the plans referenced herein will void this Certificate, and a new application must be filed with the Historic District Commission.

This Certificate is valid for a period of six months from the date of issuance. Failure to obtain a building permit in that time will be considered as a failure to comply with the Certificate and the Certificate will become invalid. If a building permit is not required, then the approved work must be completed within six months of the date of issuance of this Certificate. The Certificate can be renewed within twelve months of its issuance by Historic District Commission staff by written request and submission of a valid reason for failure to comply within the six-month deadline.
