- > All work must be completed in accordance with all other applicable state and local codes.
- Any changes from or additions or deletions to the plans referenced herein will void this Certificate, and a new application must be filed with the Historic District Commission.

This Certificate is valid for a period of six months from the date of issuance. Failure to obtain a building permit in that time will be considered as a failure to comply with the Certificate and the Certificate will become invalid. If a building permit is not required, then the approved work must be completed within six months of the date of issuance of this Certificate. The Certificate can be renewed within twelve months of its issuance by Historic District Commission staff by written request and submission of a valid reason for failure to comply within the six-month deadline.



STANDARD DESIGN SHEET


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Historic Didescription of STANDARD ORNAMENTAL IRON RAILING

Certificate of Appropriate Lop of rails fabricated out of 1-1/2" wide channel.


- # 2015-1632. Bottom of rails fabricated out of 1-1/2" wide flat bar.
 - 3. Pickets fabricated out of 1/2" square tubing every 4" on center.
 - 4: Standard height of railing is 36" stoop, 34" steps.
 - 5. Railing fabricated with or without finial on posts. Circle choice
 - Primed with gray primer and painted black.
 - 7. Railing fabricate Plain (no design) or with design. Standard designs below, please circle design of your choice. (One design every 4' – 5' approximately).
