DETAILS OF APPROVED PROJECT: The project the installation of a brick knee wall which will be located approximately 1 inch or greater inside the property line of the subject parcel on the right side. The wall will be approximately 24" tall and extend from the existing concrete retaining wall in the front yard (approximately 7'-6" from the curb line) to the existing brick wall in the rear yard. See attached photo #1 of the approximate wall location and photo #2 of an example of the wall design. The owner has the option of including a column in the front and pattern of brick. The official survey of 424 North Poplar shows the property lines and the location of the existing structures.

- > No demolition other than that specifically indicated on any attached plans is authorized under this approval.
- > All work must be completed in accordance with all other applicable state and local codes.
- Any changes from or additions or deletions to the plans referenced herein will void this Certificate, and a new application must be filed with the Historic District Commission.

This Certificate is valid for a period of six months from the date of issuance. Failure to obtain a building permit in that time will be considered as a failure to comply with the Certificate and the Certificate will become invalid. If a building permit is not required, then the approved work must be completed within six months of the date of issuance of this Certificate. The Certificate can be renewed within twelve months of its issuance by Historic District Commission staff by written request and submission of a valid reason for failure to comply within the six-month deadline.
