# MANDATORY REFERRAL-REPORT NO. <u>08-01</u> Proposed Transfer of City View Property from Central Piedmont Community College to Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools

## PROJECT PROPOSAL AND LOCATION:

Central Piedmont Community College (CPCC) proposes to convey their City View property (PID 067-11-343) located at 1609 Alleghany Street in the City of Charlotte to Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools (CMS). This property is a two acre parcel that contains a 10,472 square foot single level building, located on the southwest corner of the intersection of Alleghany Street and Ashley Road, approximately ¾ of a mile west of Freedom Drive and south of I-85. The zoning is Institutional (CD), according to the Charlotte Zoning Ordinance.

CMS has been using the property (a former classroom/administrative office structure) for a number of years for administrative office functions – specifically for Human resources and an information call center. The intended future use – following property transfer – is to continue that use.

#### PROJECT JUSTIFICATION:

CPCC no longer has a use for the property. It has been leased to CMS for several years.

## **CONSISTENCY WITH ADOPTED PUBLIC POLICIES:**

CPCC no longer has a need or use for the property. CMS is currently using the property under a lease arrangement with CPCC. This disposition will not affect the current land use or public policies. It will simply transfer ownership.

# **CONSISTENCY WITH ADOPTED LAND USE PLANS:**

This proposal is consistent with the proposed land use of Institutional prescribed in the Central District Plan (1993).

### **PROJECT IMPACT:**

No impacts are anticipated, as the intended use of the property will remain the same as present.

## **RELATIONSHIP TO OTHER PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PROJECTS:**

This property is diagonally across from the Phillip O. Berry Academy and the Freedom Regional Library.

# **ESTIMATED PROJECT COMPLETION DATE:**

It is anticipated that the transaction will occur during the first guarter of 2008.

### JOINT USE TASK FORCE REVIEW COMMENTS:

This matter was discussed at the January 2, 2008 Joint Use Task Force meeting and no joint use comments were offered.

#### PLANNING STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Planning Department staff recommends approval of this proposed transaction.

#### **CMPC PLANNING COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:**

At their January 22, 2008 meeting, the Planning Committee recommended approval by a 5-0 vote.
