MANDATORY REFERRAL REPORT NO. 99-30 CHARLOTTE MECKLENBURG PLANNING COMMISSION PROPOSED NEW SCHOOL SITE INNER CITY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL – NORTH TRYON STREET

PROJECT LOCATION

The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Board of Education proposes to purchase 17.33 acres of land (Tax Parcel Number 085-031-03 / See Attached Map) located on the northerly side of North Tryon Street Between Hilo Drive and Craighead Street. The proposed school site is zoned I-1 (CD). The site has access to both water and sewer services. Road access is provided by North Tryon Street (major thoroughfare), Graighead Street (collector street) and Hilo Drive (collector street). The site has a Duke Energy easement along part of the North Tryon Street frontage.

PROJECT PROPOSAL

This proposed project calls for the purchase of 17.33 acres of land by the Board of Education to serve as a site for a new elementary school. The new school will house approximately 800 K-5 students living in the general vicinity of the school. The school is anticipated to be completed and opened for the 2001-2002 school year.

PROJECT JUSTIFICATION

The site is located to address future enrollment growth in this region of the district in grades K through 5 and to relieve anticipated crowding in nearby elementary schools.

PROJECT IMPACT

A school at this location will provide relief from overcrowding at the nearby elementary schools and allow for future enrollment growth in grades K through 5 in this region of the school district. The additional capacity can also allow for the restoration or preservation of specialized elementary programs (computer instruction, art, music, exceptional) which are frequently reduced or eliminated during school overcrowding conditions.

A new school at this location would be consistent with the Central District Plan and supportive of the North Tryon Corridor Revitalization Study, which calls for quality development to complement the Historic Rosedale and the Winchester Medical Supply Building sites. Originally, the Central District Plan recommended multi-family residential development on this site. Later, the recommended land use was changed to industrial to reflect the July 21, 1997 rezoning of this property.

PROJECT COST

Estimated cost, developed in conjunction with the CMS Capital Needs Assessment process, is approximately \$12 million including land, construction, furnishings and equipment, design, and project management.


STAFF RECOMMENDATION


Staff recommends the land be purchased to build a new inner city elementary school. Staff also recommends that CMS file for a conditional Institutional rezoning (Inst-CD). The CD site plan will address, at a minimum, the following site design issues:

- Location of parking lots, pedestrian entrances, and vehicular access to the site with special consideration for interior stacking lanes.
- Location of green space to complement the green lawns already present on the Historic Rosedale and medical supply building sites.
- Appropriate buffering and edge treatment on back of site adjacent to existing apartment development.
- Building location and relationship to North Tryon Street.
- Streetscape improvements (street trees, decorative lighting, etc.).
- Possible joint-use and location of playground area and multi-purpose fields.

PLANNING COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

At their October 19, 1999, Planning Committee unanimously approved the purchase of 17.33 acres of land by the Board Of Education for a new inner city elementary school on North Tryon Street.
