## **RECOMMENDATION**

We have the following comments that are critical to CMS' support of this petition:

Adequacy of existing school capacity in this area is a significant problem. We are particularly concerned about rezoning cases where school utilization exceeds 100% since the proposed development will exacerbate this situation. Approval of this petition will increase overcrowding and/or reliance upon mobile classrooms at the schools listed below.

The total estimated capital cost of providing the additional school capacity for this new development is \$5,458,000, calculated as follows:

 x \$27,000 = \$2,538,000

CMS recommends the petitioner schedule a meeting with staff to discuss any opportunities that the petitioner/developer may propose to improve the adequacy of school capacity in the immediate area of the proposed development.

Average Student Yield per Unit: 0.3524 for Apartments (Since the residential units will be a mix of for sale and rental with no known break out, the factor for apartments was applied as a worst case scenario)

This development will add approximately 305 students to three schools in this area.

## **INCREMENTAL IMPACT FROM PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT\***

Existing number of housing units allowed: 266 Single Family units under R-3 zoning

Number of students potentially generated under current zoning: 118 (53 elementary, 32 middle and 33 high)

The development allowed under existing zoning would generate 118 students, while the development allowed under the proposed zoning will produce 305 students. Therefore, the net increase in the number of students generated from existing zoning to proposed zoning is 187.

\* As requested, we are also providing information regarding the difference in the number of potential students from the existing zoning to the proposed zoning. Please note that this method of determining potential numbers of students from an area underestimates the number of students CMS may gain from the new development.
