requirements to allow bicycle parking to be located in the public right-of-way and/or within the required setback, in a variety of zoning

districts, subject to additional requirements.

PLANNING STAFF REVIEW

Proposed Request Details

The text amendment contains the following provisions:

- Allows short-term bicycle parking to be located within the public right-of-way and/or within the
 required setback in the urban residential (UR-1, UR-2, UR-3, UR-C); research (RE-3 only);
 mixed use development (MUDD); uptown mixed use (UMUD); neighborhood service (NS);
 pedestrian overlay (PED); transit oriented development (TOD-R, TOD-E, and TOD-M); and
 urban industrial (UI) zoning districts, subject to the following requirements:
 - The bicycle parking shall not obstruct required sidewalks or movement from on-street parking to the required sidewalks, and shall not impact the minimum planting area or spacing requirements for street trees or required screening.
 - Required bicycle parking may be located in the public right-of-way subject to approval by the Charlotte Department of Transportation or the North Carolina Department of Transportation. If bicycle parking is not approved in the public right-of-way, then the required parking must be located entirely on the site.
 - There shall be no more than five (5) short-term bicycle parking spaces per 100 linear feet of street frontage.
