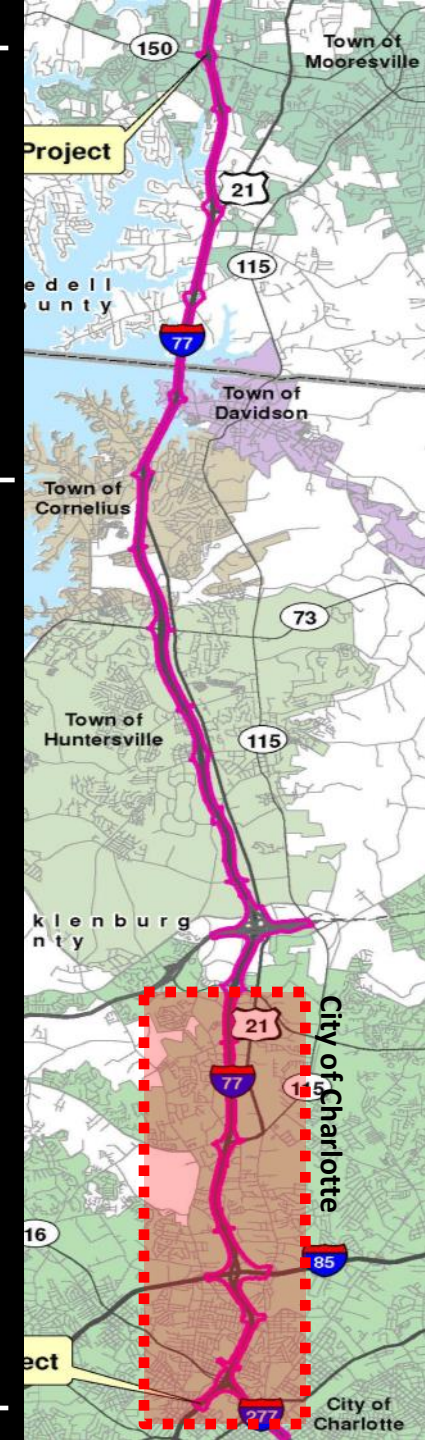
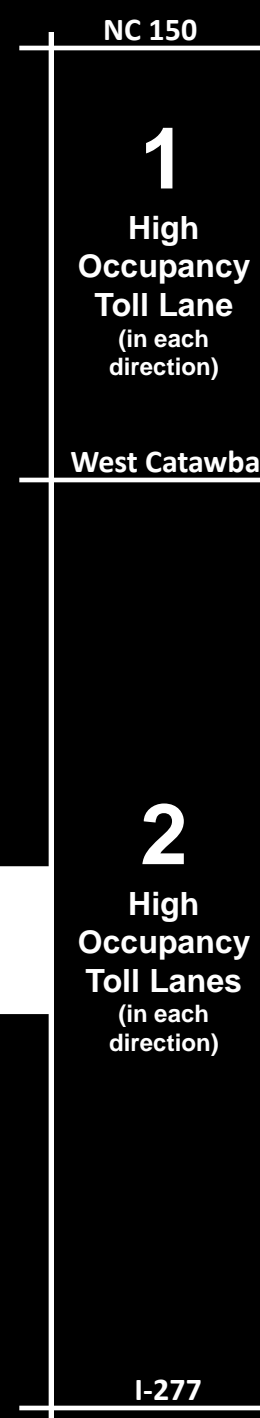

- Existing brick aesthetic walls

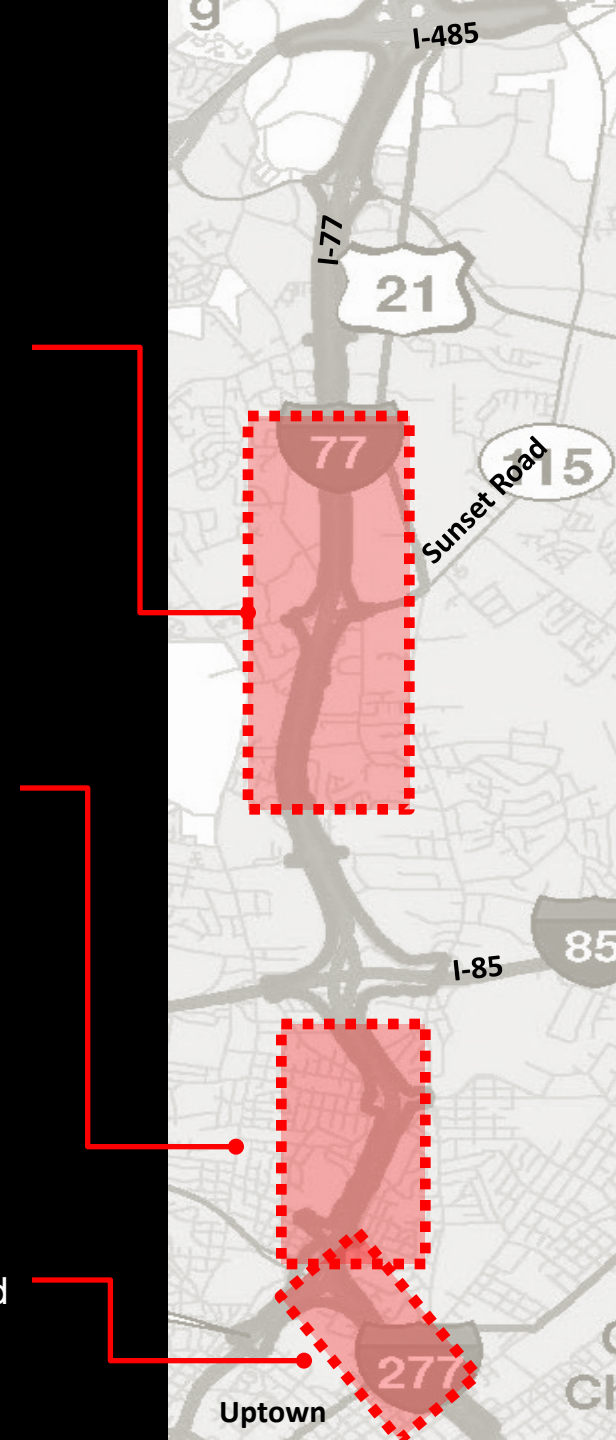

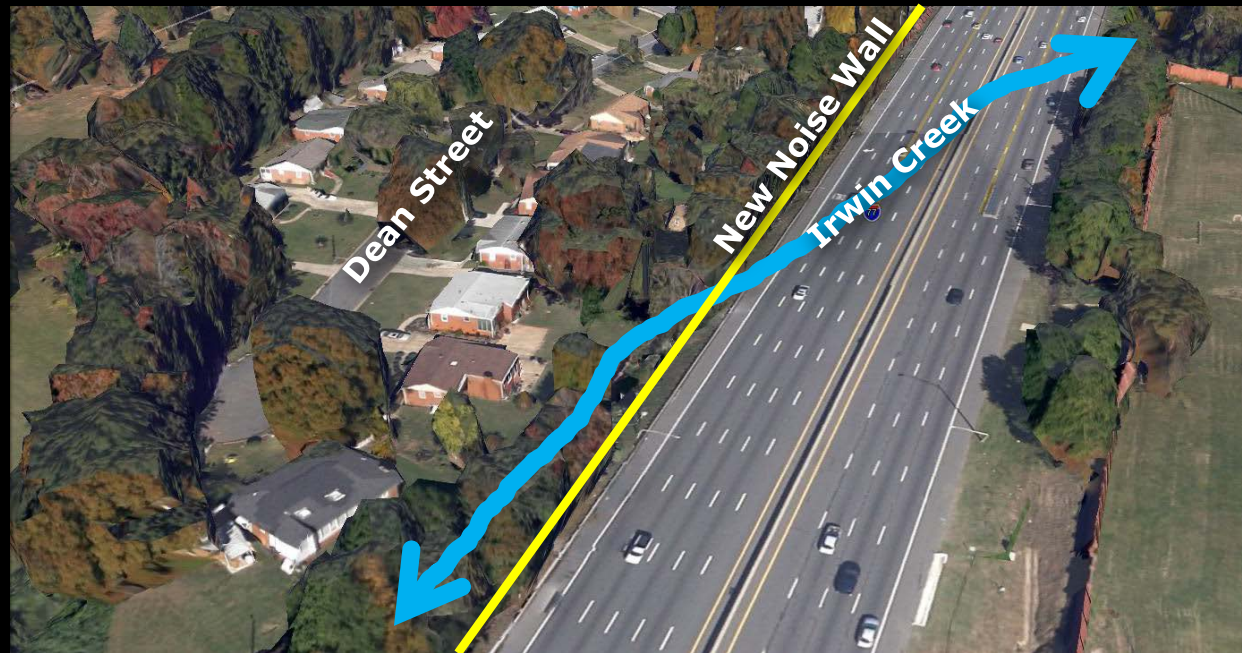

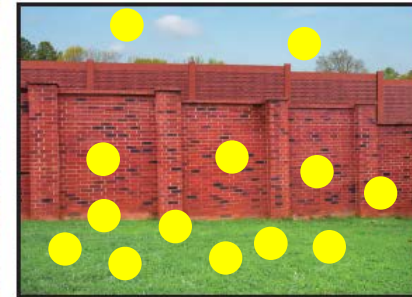

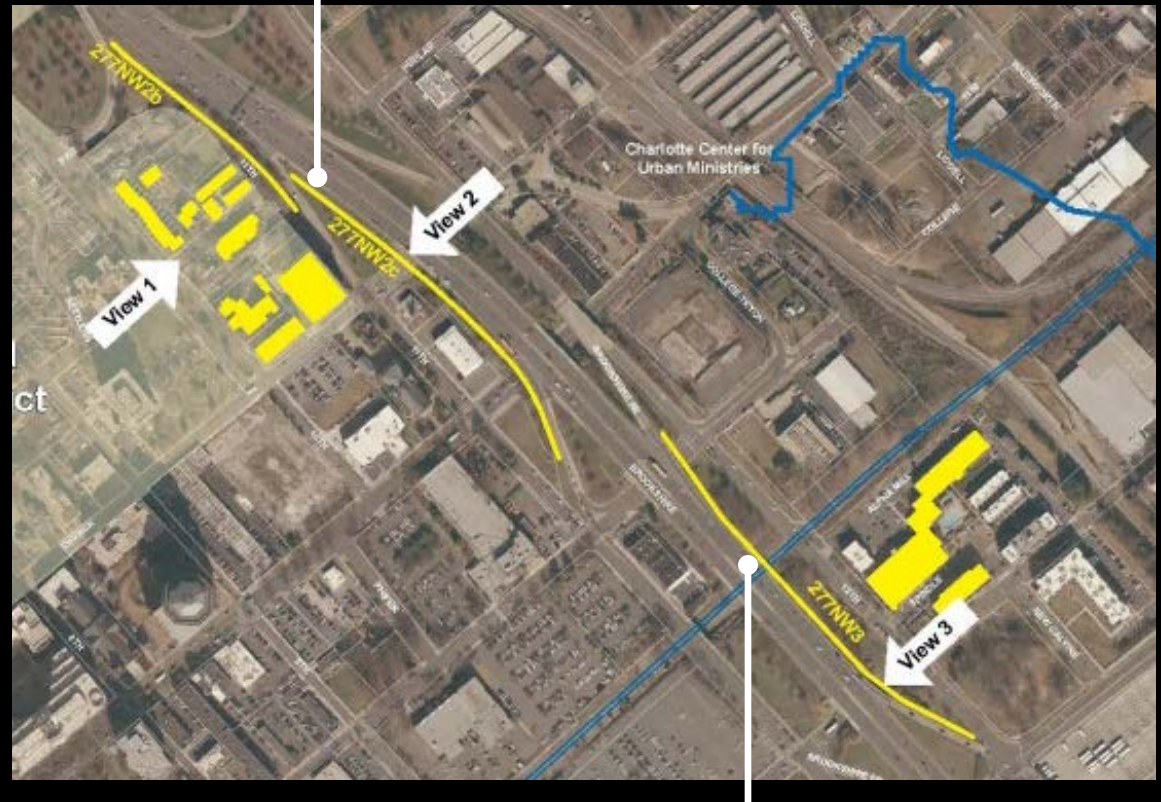

Next Steps: (Jan/Feb 2014)

- Work with NCDOT on roles and responsibilities (maintenance, access, & security)
- Confirm stormwater issue and define solution
- Final treatment ballots to historic neighborhoods in January
- City to evaluate & determine treatment choice for “freeway side”

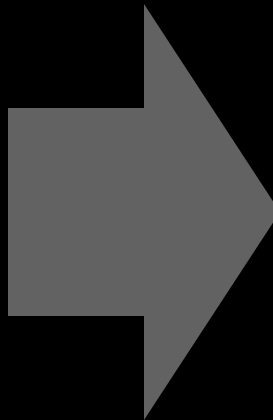
