Rezoning Petition 14-073: Text Amendment – To allow patio to Subject:

> be constructed in front setback of a business district for the purpose of temporary dining

CDOT has completed a review of the subject petition. Based on our review of the petition, we offer the following comments.

We have the following comments for the subject text amendment:

1. The USDG-based street types might be a better way to relate outdoor dining to context. We understand that the thoroughfare-based classification system is more prevalent in the zoning ordinance and therefore might be a better option in the short-term. Looking ahead, the table below represents a recommended approach if a USDG-based system could be applied.
