Number of housing units allowed under current zoning: The approximately 3.45 acres zoned 0-1 would allow approximately 41.4 dwelling units.

The subject property is developed with a retail building.

IMPACT OF THE PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

Proposed Housing Units: The conditional UR-2(CD) zoning request seeks to allow 180 multi-family dwelling units, in no more than 12 principal buildings limited to three stories in height.

Average Student Yield per Unit: 0.3661

RECOMMENDATION

Adequacy of existing school capacity in this area is a significant problem. We are particularly concerned about rezoning cases where school utilization exceeds 100% since the proposed development may exacerbate those situations. Approval of this petition may increase overcrowding and/or reliance upon mobile classrooms at the schools listed above.





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The total estimated capital cost of providing the additional school capacity for this new development is \$1,473,000; calculated as follows:

Elementary School: 35x \$20,000 = \$700,000

Middle School: 16x \$23,000 = \$368,000

High School: 15x \$27,000 = \$405,000

CMS recommends that the petitioner/developer schedule a meeting with staff to discuss mitigation of the cost to improve the adequacy of school capacity at the potentially affected schools.
