

## Petition No: 2019-047 Revised

### IMPACT UNDER CURRENT ZONING

Number of housing units allowed under current zoning: Petition 2016-32 rezoned the subject property to the MUDD-O district to allow a maximum of 581 multi-family dwelling units and accessory uses.

The subject property is developed with 582 multi-family dwelling units, per tax records as of 4-16-19.

Number of students potentially generated under current zoning: 100 student(s) (57 elementary, 17 middle, 26 high)

### IMPACT OF THE PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

*Proposed Housing Units:* The conditional **MUDD-O SPA site plan amendment** request seeks to allow an additional 273 multi-family units for a total of 854, with accessory uses, limited to 5 stories in height.

*CMS Planning Area:* 10, 11, 12, 13

Average Student Yield per Unit: 0.1714

This development may add 47 student(s) to the schools in this area.

The total estimated capital cost of providing the additional school capacity for this new development is \$1,742,000; calculated as follows:

Elementary School: **27**x \$34,000 = \$918,000  
 Middle School: **8**x \$37,000 = \$296,000  
 High School: **12**x \$44,000 = \$528,000

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### **RECOMMENDATION**

Adequacy of existing school capacity in this area is a significant problem. We are particularly concerned about a rezoning case where school utilization exceeds 100% since the proposed development may exacerbate the situation. Approval of this petition may increase overcrowding and/or reliance upon mobile classrooms at the school(s) listed above.
