OF CHARLOTTE RESTAURANTS AND NIGHTCLUBS SIMILARITIES & DIFFERENCES

SIMILARITIES

- May serve beverages
 including alcohol
- May serve meal
- May provide music
- Social gathering location
- May provide various forms of entertainment

DIFFERENCES

- Restaurants allow all ages
- Nightclubs usually have a cover charge
- Later hours of operation are associated with nightclubs
- Restaurants have higher food sales



SECONDARY IMPACTS

Restaurants <u>Positive Impacts</u>



- Can walk to establishments
- Generates commerce

Nightclubs/Bars Positive Impacts

- Generates commerce
- Provides entertainment

Negative Impacts

- Noise
- Traffic



Negative Impacts

- Noise/Loud Talking
- Nuisance/Trash
- Traffic/Light Pollution
- Crime

- New York City, New York
- Chicago, Illinois
- Philadelphia, Pennsylvania
- Washington, D.C.
- Boston, Massachusetts
- Fort Worth, Texas



City Survey Results – Nightclubs & Bars

- Separation Distances range from 50' to 500'
- Size limitations up to 2,500 sq. ft.
- Cannot adjoin a single family district unless on arterial/freeway
- Additional permits for dancing, entertainment, late-hours



City Survey Results – Nightclubs & Bars

- Soundproofing of buildings
- Entrances do not face residential parcels
- Doors/windows placed to decrease noise
- Exterior doors remain closed after midnight except in/out



City Survey Results – Nightclubs & Bars

- 70 decibels at property line
- Sound amplification prohibited after midnight
- Structure, signs, lighting, parking design, parking access and parking location compatible with area
- Shall not create traffic congestion or spillover parking in residential neighborhoods
- Traffic directed away from residential districts after midnight



- If open past 3:00 am, separation distances 300'
- Limitations on square footage 2,500
- Additional permits may be required
- 70 decibels
- 51% or more sales from food
- Adequate kitchen facilities
- Variety of entrees on menu
- Entrances do not face residential parcels

CITY OF CHARLOTTE RESTAURANT CONSIDERATION

Definition

- Consider approach that has multi-definitions of restaurant use based on hours of operation
- Include category of restaurants that provides for social entertainment

Entertainment

 Allow various forms of entertainment to be associated with restaurant use based on hours of operation



NIGHTCLUB/BAR CONSIDERATION

- Definition
 - Rewrite definition to clarify use
- Separation Requirement
 - Consider separation under prescribed conditions
- Secondary Impacts
 - Address Noise, Traffic, Crime and Lighting Impacts
